



Reflections from the Heart by Fr. Ivan



"Announce the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light." At

times, darkness can feel like life and life can feel like darkness. We cannot see darkness, but we experience it and the effects of low light or no light at all. Darkness can feel heavy, cold, isolated, and lonely. It can also feel creepy, fearful and unsafe inside. The darkness we speak of is not like the beauty of a dark night, where the noise of light, the busy lights, does not interrupt the beauty of a night sky filled with endless stars, galaxies and an array of constellations. That is God's gracious gift and the beauty of creation. The darkness we speak of is the kind of darkness we hope to avoid. The type of darkness where beauty seems hidden and unrecognizable. The kind of darkness where the pathways we take for granted seem closed off and inaccessible. The darkness that causes the walkways we prefer to walk daily to not be easily seen. They seem somehow lost or unavailable to us. The darkness we simply cannot see and it causes us not to be able to see, filling us with fear of what may come or what may be. We lose our sense of direction. We lose our cool and calm. The darkness enters in. It creeps in slowly and unnoticed. It tries to hide, cover and blind the light. We feel lost, vulnerable, unsure and afraid. There is also the fear of an interior darkness. It has the same effects and experiences of the darkness around us. The same feelings are caused inside of us. This kind of darkness can be extremely dark like a dark depression or as deep as a deep, dark secret. Sin is darkness. Sin causes darkness and darkness causes sin. Darkness blinds truth, covers beauty, and hides goodness. Fear not! Jesus is the Light of the World that burns ever so brightly within us. He is the light that darkness runs from, hides from, and fears. The Light of Christ can never be extinguished. Darkness can never overcome this light. Jesus conquered death, darkness and the enemy of light. Saint John the Evangelist says, when Jesus comes in his glorious splendor and radiant light that, "Night will be no more, nor will they need light from lamp or sun, for the Lord God shall give them light, and they shall reign forever and ever." Go therefore without fear and "Announce the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light."

The monstrance is a holy vessel used in sacred liturgy for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament outside of the Mass. It provides us with the sacred privilege as faithful disciples to be truly in the real presence of Jesus. To watch and pray with Jesus in

Eucharist, in sacred silence and in the sacred inner room God has carved out for himself on the altar and in the chapel within our hearts.

The monstrance consecrated and dedicated for our newly renovated Chapel of the Angels has been in our Annunciation Family for some time. The monstrance previous belonged to the late Cardinal Jaime L. Sin of Manila and was graciously donated to our parish family. The monstrance was recently restored to its original beauty. The pillar of the monstrance is Our Lady of the Eucharist. The rays surrounding the monstrance help us to contemplate the radiant light and glory that bursts forth and emanates from Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament piercing the inner rooms of our heart, bringing forth light, love and life. O come let us adore him. We plan to re-open Eucharistic Adoration in the Chapel of the Angels beginning on Monday, July 10th.

We will begin with an Adoration Schedule of **Monday through Friday, after the 7am Mass until**

7pm. We need two people to commit as Weekly Adorers for each hour in order to make this schedule possible.

Is the Lord calling you to a closer relationship with Him? Please consider signing up to pray with Him for one hour

each week. It is easy to sign up and we have a new online system to make it easy to ask for a sub for your hour if something comes up and you are not able to make it that day. All are welcome to pray for any amount of time and you are welcome to sign up to be on the list as a substitute adorer as well.



Pillars of Faith By Fr. Stephen Baumann

Birth of John the Baptist – June 14th - John the Baptist was a sign of expectation and promise, the last of the line of prophets sent "to prepare a perfect people for Christ the Lord." (Collect of Mass). Fr. Carroll Stuhlmueller called him "the fierce prophet of truth and justice. So great was John the Baptist that the entire prophetic ministry of the Hebrew Scriptures was summed up in him."

John preached that self-purification was necessary before one could embrace the Lord. Preparation for the coming of the Messiah must include prayer and penance. His message was not original but was in the long tradition of the prophets of the Covenant. Since Jesus, the Messiah, was already in the midst of the people, John was telling them to reflect and look into their lives so that they would be able to recognize Jesus.

John's questions and message are as relevant today as they were to his audience. There were people with doubts who were confused and wondering. There were people who were seeking, hoping, and believing, like ourselves. John asked them to believe more strongly and to seek to improve their spiritual lives. He cried out with a force that had a ring of authority to it, like the prophets of old. "I am the voice of one crying out in the desert. Make straight the way of the Lord. "(John 1:23 and Isaiah 40:1).

John was telling the people of Israel, as well as us, to put interior selves in order, so that we might be ready for the coming of God. Today, we can understand John's message as a plea to make ourselves more worthy of God in our lives. "The voice of John the Baptist challenges us to repentance, and points the way to Christ the Lord. Conversion opens the way to appreciating and enhancing the Spirit of God in us, and it opens the way to a deeper relationship with God."

All of us can intensify our spiritual efforts, and all of us have untapped spiritual resources, and maybe unanswered spiritual graces. Such openness and effort, such intense spiritual desire on our part, will lead to profound personal and spiritual changes, which will then affect our life.

Today, let us pray: "Open our ears to his message, and free our hearts to turn from our sins and receive the life of the Gospel." We can then join our voices to the voice of John the Baptist, and announce to our world that Jesus is our salvation and our peace.
