Reflections from the Heart by Fr. Ivan

"In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." Not obtaining spiritual guidance or direction, or receiving spiritual counsel, is like a person going on a journey to a familiar place or an individual traveling to a remote place for the first time without planning the course or seeking the best



route to travel feeling no need for assistance or guidance along the way. At times, we travel life busy and hurried. We move from one place to another or from one conversation to another, never stopping to look around, to notice where we are, where we came from or where we are heading. We travel without really knowing where we are going or where life is taking us. Where are you heading, moving so quickly, so fast, so hurried? Do you know? Stopping and asking the Lord for spiritual direction is like a person who realizes they are lost or moving so quickly and anxiously not going anywhere. We move but fail to reach our true destination, which is divine intimacy and right relation with God. Rather than stopping and asking the Lord for direction, we tend to move through life hurried and fast paced without seeking input from the Lord or discerning with him where he wills to take us. Without God's assistance or without God's presence, we travel life all by ourselves, all alone, self-directed with no real end or purpose in mind. We live life in the fast lane rather than slow it down, stopping to look around, listening for God's voice guiding us this way or that way. We avoid asking for direction. We avoid prayerful contemplation and taking the beautiful peaceful, scenic route. We avoid contemplating with the Lord his guidance and direction as he directs us on our faith journey. As he guides us along the everlasting way. This is the will of God the Father, for you his child in Christ Jesus his Son. This is the cause of our joy and the reason for our gratitude and thankfulness. God knows where he desires you to be, walks with you, carries you and brings you safely into his arms and heart, into his life and love, into his eternal presence and your heavenly home. Christ is the way and destination the Father has chosen for you, the Holy Spirit your spiritual guide and director, the Word of God and Blessed Eucharist your sustenance, Mary and Joseph your beacon and light. What is missing is gratitude. To say thank you.





St. Nicholas, Bishop - December 6



Honored in both the Eastern and Western Churches, we know only that St. Nicholas was Bishop of Myra in Lycia (now part of Turkey). In the East he is called the Wonderworker, and legends abound. Two beautiful prayers in the

Byzantine Liturgy (Mass) for this commemoration express an appreciation of this saint. I quote them, a Troparion and a Kontakion:

"Oh Father and Pontiff Nicholas, the holiness of your life was set before your flock as a rule of faith, an example of meekness and a teaching of temperance; wherefore you acquired greatness through humility and spiritual wealth through poverty. Pray to Christ that he may save our souls."

"In Myra, you proved yourself to be a priest, a servant of divine things, O Saint, for you fulfilled the Gospel of Christ, O Holy One: you gave up your life for your people and saved the innocent from death. You have been sanctified, for you were a great guide towards the things of God." (Byzantine Daily Worship).

St. Nicholas was such a model bishop, and now a saint. Over the centuries, the admiration of many Christians for Nicholas has been expressed in the colorful stories that have been told and retold about him.

Perhaps the best-known story about Nicholas concerns his charity toward a poor father who was unable to provide dowries for his three marriageable daughters. Rather than see them forced into prostitution, Nicholas secretly tossed a bag of gold through the poor man's window on three separate occasions, thus enabling the three daughters to be married.

Over the centuries, this particular legend evolved into the custom of gift-giving on the saint's feast In the English-speaking countries, St. day. Nicholas became, by a twist of the tongue, "Santa Claus," further expanding the example of generosity portrayed by this holy bishop.

In many Polish homes throughout the world, a beloved family tradition is the breaking of the oplatek on Christmas Eve. Oplatek is a thin wafer made from flour and water

similar in taste and consistency to the hosts that are used for communion during Mass. Oplatki are often stamped with an elaborate Christmas scene.

Historically, these would be distributed by the church to parishioners' homes during the Advent season. The Christmas wafer is shared before Wigilia, the Christmas Eve supper. Wigilia comes from the Latin word "vigilare" which means to wait.

The oplatek is meant to remind families of the Eucharistic bread at Mass and makes a further connection between Christmas and the gift of the Eucharist, the presence of God among us.

FLORIDIANS SHOULD DECLINE TO SIGN PETITION FOR DANGEROUS PRO-ABORTION AMENDMENT

An extremely grave initiative is underway in Florida that seeks to erase pro-life protections by inserting language into the Florida Constitution banning regulation of abortion. Abortion activists are working to gather petition signatures to place a pro-abortion constitutional amendment, titled *Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion*, on the November 2024 ballot. This amendment would allow abortion up until birth, including when the baby is capable of feeling pain, and would eliminate laws requiring parental consent and safety protocols for women.

Floridians should not sign the petition.
