Reflections from the Heart by Fr. Ivan

"Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins vou retain are retained." The heart and foundation of Ignatian Spirituality is simple. It relies on the principle that God in his great love, desiring nothing more than to share himself, created us that we may have a share in his goodness, therefore enjoy his friendship happiness for and all Finding God in all eternity. things becomes our life long



goal. Once we find God and are in God's presence, we can forget ourselves, our hurts, our pains, our past and current sufferings and truly be present to God who is presence himself. When we are truly present to God and truly, with him without hesitation, reservation, fear or resistance we are in need of nothing more than what God has graciously offered us, the gift of his endless joy, the grace of perpetual peace and the profound healing that leads us and brings us reconciliation. God graciously provides the true gifts we need, desire and long for more than honor, riches, wealth, titles, fortune and fame. The gift and fruits of the Holy Spirit are most helpful for our journey. They inspire and encourage us to live a life of blessedness, which is joyful, and not a life of unforgiveness, which is sorrowful. Ignatius of Loyola informs us and invites us to consider there are two spirits that are always at work within us, as well as within the world, competing to get our attention. The good spirit, that is the Holy Spirit, gently draws us, attracts us and leads us to find God in all things, people and circumstances, therefore encountering joy, healing, love, hope, blessedness, faith. The Holy Spirit floods us in difficult situations and even floods us in joyful celebrations with his gifts of knowledge, wisdom, and counsel, helping us to better understand what is happening, shedding light on why people are yelling, so angry, overacting or hurting, so we can better respond in a way that is helpful, useful and not hurtful. The bad spirit, the Devil, forcefully distracts us and even spiritually snatches us away from God, causing us grief, sorrow, heartache, headaches and pain. The enemy robs us of goodness and interior joy and then draws us to encounter darkness, turmoil, desolation, depression and negative emotions that cause us to want and pursue disordered desires that wound us. The good spirit helps us to forgive and forget, giving us lasting joy and freedom. The bad spirit makes us slaves of unforgiveness and there is no joy in that.

March/April Impact Report

Through emergency outreach, we helped 26 households to include 44 adults and 24 children. We took an additional 61 calls that were out of our area, so we connected them with resources in their areas. Most of the assistance for our neighbors in need involved rent and utilities. One single mom's job security was jeopardized by unstable childcare for her 3 young children which resulted in her losing her job. With reliable childcare established and a new job, she can now be a stable employee. We helped with rent until she received her new employment paycheck thus avoiding eviction and homelessness. *See below for March/April details*

St. Pancras, Martyr - May 12

Though we know little about St. Pancras, his memory is cherished by the Church. It is known that he died for Christ, and according to some sources he was brought to Rome from Syria or Phrygia as an orphan. When he was 14 years old, he was martyred by being beheaded, about the year 304.

Commenting on the presence of God in times of tribulation, St. Bernard wrote: "It is good for me to be sad, O Lord, as long as you are with me, rather than to be a king apart from you, to feast without you, to boast without you. It is better for me to embrace you in

tribulation, to have you with me in the furnace, than to be without you in heaven."

For what do I have in heaven apart from you? What have I desired on earth? Gold is tested in the furnace, and the just by the trial of tribulation. There, yes there, you are present with them, Lord. You are there in the midst of those gathered in your name, as you were once with the three young men in the fiery furnace.

Why are we afraid, why do we hesitate, who do we flee from this furnace? The fire rages, but the Lord is with us in tribulation. If God is with us, who can be against us? And if he then rescues us, who will steal us from his hand? Lastly, if he honors us, who can dishonor us? If he honors us, who can humiliate us?" (Sermon on Psalm 91, Qui Habitat; Vulgate, Ps. 90).
