Hearing Assist System in the Church

Are you aware that we have a "Loop" System in our Church?

It is compatible with hearing aids that have the T-Coil feature turned on. If you use a hearing aid, and you are not sure it is compatible with the "Loop" system, please contact your Hearing Specialist to see if you need to make an office visit to have the T-Coil turned on or if you can engage it through an app.

For those who do not have hearing aids or if they are not compatible with the Loop System, you may use one of our headsets, or bring your own ear piece to use with the transmitter. There are a total of 12 transmitters and you may check one out by going to the Priest Sacristy, which is off the Narthex. Please see Mary Ann Fox or one of the Sacristans to obtain a transmitter.



REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART

"Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out... He instructed them to take nothing for the journey." Being poor in spirit is the first beatitude of Jesus. It is at the heart of who Jesus is. It is at the very core of his identity as the Christ. The essence of being the beloved Son of the Father. Making himself small, tiny, humble, least, last is the driving force in the mission of Christ and the great gift of his ministry, which is to remain poor letting the Father provide for him always, in every situation and circumstance no matter how dire or life threatening it is or becomes. Jesus remained ever so poor and trusting that Scripture boldly proclaims that he humbled himself to the point of death on a cross. Jesus remained confidently entrusted to the protective care of the Father and under the watchful guidance and direction of the Holy Spirit. Since Poverty of Spirit is who Jesus is and remains, perfectly poor, dependent, relying and trusting God always in all things, therefore, at the heart of anyone who wishes to be called Christian, to be like Christ, must imitate and follow the poverty of spirit Jesus boldly lives and breathes into all things. Not an imitation Christian or to imitate Christ in some aspects of his life or ministry but to actually become Christ-like, to be Christ, the Father's beloved child in every way, in every word, thought, action and deed. The poverty of Christ scares us. We see it as an impossibility to attain. We are afraid to let go and allow God to provide for our needs. Trust is at the heart of faith. It is who Jesus is. It is what forms the bond and strengthens and keeps Jesus faithful to the loving covenant with the Father and all humanity. Fear is the result and consequence of sin. We are afraid because this world tells us to be. We lack trust because this world betrays us. We have lost faith and confidence because our family and friends lie to us, cheat us, and rob us of a joyful, faithful and loving relation with God our heavenly Father. However, the poor perfect love of Jesus casts out all fear. Jesus encourages us to follow him, to be him. If you embrace the poverty of the spirit of Jesus, which he inspires in the hearts of all of his faithful followers and disciples, Christ will enrich you in your poverty and strengthen you in your weakness, to trust that God always provides.

Five Biblical Reasons For Wanting To Spend One Hour With Jesus In The Blessed Sacrament

1. He is really there! "I myself am the living bread come down from heaven." (Jn 6:35)

2. Day and night Jesus dwells in the Blessed Sacrament because of his Infinite love for you!

"Behold I will be with you always even to the end of the world," because "I have loved you with an everlasting love, and constant is my affection for you." (Mt 28:20; Jer 31:3)

3. The specific way that Jesus asks you to love him in return is to spend one quiet hour with him in the Blessed Sacrament.

"Where your treasure is, there is your heart...." "Could you not watch one hour with me?" (Mt 6:21; 26:40)

4. When you look upon the Sacred Host, you look upon Jesus, the Son of God.

"Indeed, this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks upon the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life. Him I will raise up on the last day." (Jn 6:40)

5. Each moment that you spend in His Eucharistic Presence will increase his divine life within you and deepen your personal relationship and friendship with him.

"I have come that you may have life, and have it more abundantly." "I am the vine and you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him shall bear much fruit because without me, you can do nothing." (Jn 15:5)



St. Junipero Serra – July 1



In September of 1731 Junipero Serra (1713-1784) professed religious vows. He was known as a pious and intelligent young man. After his ordination to the priesthood in 1738, he pursued graduate studies in theology and then taught theology for about ten years. Fr. Serra was an accomplished homilist (preacher), but always had a great desire to be a missionary.

He requested to be assigned to the missions of New Spain. In making his request he wrote: "All my life I have wanted to be a missioner. I have wanted to carry the gospel teachings to those who have never heard of God and the kingdom he has prepared for them. But I became proud and allowed myself to be distracted by academic studies. Now I am filled with remorse that my ambition has been so long delayed."

His wish was granted and he was finally assigned to New Spain. He reached Mexico in 1750. For Father Serra and the Friars who labored with him, the work was arduous, but they were tireless in preaching the gospel and improving the life of the Indians in Mexico and in California.

What they accomplished is impressive; what they did for the Indians admirable. In an essay, "Father of California," Fr. Albert J. Nevins wrote:

"Serra and his friars wanted nothing for themselves but everything for their people Indians. Thev found а annihilating one another in cannibalistic rituals and brought them into the peace of Christ. They integrated the Indians into their own society and did not destroy them as did the advancing Anglo-Saxons. Those who saw the California missions first hand - and many of these witnesses were neither Catholic nor Spanish – had nothing but admiration for the work of the padres." (Builders of Catholic America, p. 86).

In his homily at the mass of beatification of Father Serra, Pope St. John Paul II said: "He is a shining example of Christian virtue and the missionary spirit. His great good was to bring the gospel to the native peoples of America, so that they, too, might be consecrated in the truth."

St. Junipero Serra was canonized by Pope Francis on September 23, 2015 at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D. C.

It is now our joy to honor St. Junipero Serra in liturgy and prayer, and to ask his intercession that our efforts to spread the gospel message will also bear much fruit.
