

REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART

by Fr. Ivan

"I sought the LORD, and he answered me and delivered me from all my fears." One of my favorite prayers is "Lord, we beg you to visit this house and banish from it all the deadly power of the enemy. May your holy angels dwell here to keep us in peace, and may your blessing be upon us always. We ask this through Christ our Lord." The prayer is a prayer of deliverance, which comes from Night Prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours, recited by clergy, religious and devoted laity at the conclusion of the day. The special prayer is an optional prayer when Night Prayer falls on a solemnity that does not occur on a Sunday, but I am inspired to recite it daily. I find myself offering prayer when experiencing a difficult conversation, when a challenging situation arises, and even when there seems to be a strong sense of heaviness, darkness or gloom in a room, situation or conversation I find myself in. I find myself reciting this prayer upon entering our campus, or while entering a church or any public building. I even offer the prayer before entering the office, a home, or just while entering the quiet temple in my own heart before entering and offering quiet, intimate prayer with the Lord. It is a gracious opportunity to seek God's favor and ask for assistance, grace and help. In a particular way, to pray for God's presence in order to remove the presence of evil from our midst. To invite God's holy angels and saints to enter into communion with us here on earth while we commune with them spiritually in heaven and experience the gift of God's peace and blessing. Asking God to keep us in peace is in a sense asking God, begging him, even pleading with him to rid us of all that distracts and detracts us from his peace - sin, evil, violence, war, hatred, anger, and lack of forgiveness, charity, respect and love. Asking for peace is asking God to deliver you from all of your enemies especially your fears. We ask for help and assistance from God in order to eliminate, banish from us and heal us from our innermost fears. Those things that choke and stifle peace and keep us from freely experiencing an intimate and loving relationship with God. Fear imprisons us. Prayer liberates us, frees us, floods us with hope and fills us with peace. Seek the Lord. He will answer you and grant you pardon and give you peace.





St. Clare, Virgin - August 11th



Next to St. Francis of Assisi, St. Clare (1193-1253) was most responsible for the growth and spread of the Franciscans and the Franciscan ideal. Born in Assisi of wealthy parents, Clare refused to

marry in her early teens, as was customary in those days. A few years later, after hearing a sermon by Francis of Assisi, she fled her home to join him and his followers and to live the life of gospel poverty.

Francis received her and gave her the veil at the Portiuncula chapel in Assisi on Palm Sunday in the year 1212. Clare was then nineteen years old. She was shortly joined by her sister, and resisted several attempts by her family to force them to return home. Later, she was joined by another sister and her mother at the convent at the church of San Damiano. Francis charged her under obedience to accept the office of abbess, which she then held the rest of her life – for approximately 40 years.

Clare's understanding of poverty embodied in the Rule of the Poor Clare Nuns today, is rather strict. She was a respected religious person of her time, and was credited with many miracles throughout her life, notably the saving of her convent and the town of Assisi from the Saracen invaders by placing the Blessed Sacrament on the walls of her convent.

St. Clare was exemplary in prayer, patient in suffering (enduring an illness of thirty years that was quite confining), yet she was a spirited, energetic leader and spiritual guide. She is portrayed as loving, kind and charitable toward her sisters, joyful and humble at all times. She was motivated by her love of the gospel ideal of simplicity of life, after the example of Jesus.

This is all beautifully expressed in a letter to Blessed Agnes of Prague, daughter of the King of Bohemia (modern day Slovakia), and abbess at a convent she established in Prague: Christ is a mirror "without cloud."

"Queen and bride of Jesus Christ, look into that mirror daily and study well your reflection that you may adorn yourself mind and body, with an enveloping garment of every virtue, and thus find yourself in flowers and gowns befitting the daughter and most chaste bride of the King on high. In this mirror, blessed poverty, holy humility and ineffable love are also reflected. With the grace of God the whole mirror will be your source of contemplation." (2nd Reading, Liturgy of the Hours).

Though written to Blessed Agnes, St. Clare was telling us of herself. St. Clare died in 1253, and was canonized just two years after her death.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT AMENDMENT 4

FLORIDA'S PRO-ABORTION AMENDMENT

What is Amendment 4?

Amendment 4 is a proposed amendment to the Florida Constitution that would essentially establish an unlimited right to abortion throughout pregnancy even when the heartbeat of the preborn child is detected, when the preborn child can experience pain, and when the child is capable of living outside the womb. Amendment 4 will appear on the November 5, 2024 ballot and require approval from 60% of the electorate to pass.

What would Amendment 4 do?

PUT WOMEN AT RISK

Amendment 4 would jeopardize existing laws and prohibit new ones that voters on both sides of the abortion issue support, including health and safety laws that protect women.

ALLOW SECOND AND THIRD TRIMESTER ABORTIONS Though not defined in the amendment, "viability" is defined in Florida law as the stage of development when the life of a fetus is sustainable outside the womb (Ch. 390.011(15)), generally accepted to be 22-24 weeks of pregnancy, or about 6 months.

CREATE A BROAD "HEALTH" LOOPHOLE

"Patient's health" is not defined in the amendment, allowing post-viability, extremely late-term abortions for treatable, temporary health concerns. Emotional health would justify an abortion when a child could survive outside the womb.

WEAKEN MEDICAL DOCTOR REQUIREMENT

"Healthcare providers" – not just physicians – could determine if an abortion is "necessary" to protect the mother's "health." Even some employees of abortion clinics, such as nurses and counselors, could approve late-term abortions.

ELIMINATE PARENTAL CONSENT

While preserving parental notification in our state constitution (Article X, Section 22), the amendment would invalidate the current law that requires parental consent for a minor to have an abortion (Ch. 390.01114(5)), making abortion the only medical decision for which parents have no say.

Would abortion be illegal in Florida if Amendment 4 does not pass?

If Amendment 4 does not pass, abortion would still be legal in Florida until a baby's heartbeat can be detected. Current laws that protect the safety of women would remain in effect.

Doesn't Amendment 4 simply restore Florida back to when Roe v. Wade was in effect?

Amendment 4 goes dangerously beyond what was permitted in the Roe v. Wade ruling. It would eliminate important health and safety measures that protect women, remove parental consent for any minor seeking an abortion, and allow for abortion through the third trimester of pregnancy.

Aren't late term abortions very rare?

Because they are currently not permitted by Florida law, they are extremely rare. There are exceptions in the law that allow late-term abortions to preserve the life of the mother or to avert serious risk of substantial, irreversible impairment of a major bodily function. If Amendment 4 passes, its broad loopholes would allow non-physicians to cite minor, treatable conditions to justify abortions, and there would be many more late-term abortions in Florida.

Will miscarriage care or ectopic pregnancy treatment be denied if Amendment 4 fails?

There is a fundamental difference between an elective abortion and the care provided after a miscarriage or for ectopic pregnancies. Amendment 4 will have no effect on the care a pregnant woman receives in an emergency. Women can always receive necessary and timely lifesaving medical treatment, including in Catholic hospitals. No law restricts this care in Florida.

How is the Church helping pregnant women in need?

The Catholic Church is committed to helping women in need during and after pregnancies. For decades, numerous Catholic social service agencies, in collaboration with faithbased and secular organizations, have assisted pregnant women in need with material resources and personal accompaniment during pregnancy and after their child is born.

What is the Church doing to defeat Amendment 4?

Each diocese in Florida is working together, through the Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops, to help Catholics understand the dangers of Amendment 4 to women, their children and their families. The Church supports the Florida Voters Against Extremism coalition to educate voters on how Amendment 4 is harmful for Floridians.

What can I do to help defeat Amendment 4?

- 1. VOTE NO on Amendment 4
- 2. EDUCATE YOURSELF and TELL OTHERS about the dangers of Amendment 4
- PRAY & Fast


