

REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART by Fr. Ivan

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever." Christ himself tells us, so we must truly believe with unwavering faith, that he is truly, really and substantially alive and present in the Eucharistic bread offered and in the consecrated wine blessed on the sacred altar. No longer a piece of lifeless bread that may feed us or can sustain us for a brief moment of time or table wine that will briefly warm and cheer our hearts or cause our spirits to rejoice for a bit, but truly alive and truly present, his holy Body in his holy vessel, his precious Blood in his precious chalice. A gift of bread and wine from the Father that becomes Blessed, Sacrament, Eucharistic, life-giving, life-saving, life-changing, sustaining life, providing life eternal to all who faithfully receive him and all who faithfully believe in him. Through the graciousness of the Father and the gracious Gift of the Holy Spirit with the help and assistance of the consecrated ordained poverty of the priesthood of Jesus Christ, the Lord faithfully and graciously rains down from heaven his beloved Son and the gifts he brings through his Paschal Mystery. The redemptive gifts his Passion, Death, and Resurrection gained and won for us. This is the mystery of our faith. The hope and gifts we expect and desire to receive from the humble One who is true God and true Man and desires to become true food and true drink for you and for me. Grace that we may perpetually live in the life of Christ, share his Spirit and remain united to the Father, through him, with him and in him. Blessing that we may live a life with Christ and with him, be poor in spirit, meek in nature, and pure of heart. Healing that we may thank God for freeing us from the bonds of death and the pain, hurt and suffering caused by the effects of our own disobedience and sinfulness and the disordered desires and disrespect of others. Love that we may fully receive the goodness of God, celebrate the graciousness of his love and with God's love, love one another as God has loved us. Mercy that we may learn from our merciful Father how to be kind and patient with one another and forgive one another from the heart. Pardon that we may forgive ourselves. Peace that we may not worry but trust that God will never abandon us and will provide living bread for us, always.





St. Rose of Lima, Virgin – August 23rd



By today's standards, and most probably by those of her day, the sanity of St. Rose of Lima (1586-1617) would have been questioned. Her behavior was judged to be strange, because it made other people uncomfortable. The saints can do that to us, but Rose was at peace with God, regardless.

Born in Lima, Peru of Spanish parents, her life was one of penance and prayer. Reputedly, a very beautiful young woman, she resisted the efforts of her parents who insisted that she marry. Imprudently, perhaps, she disfigured herself to appear unattractive. Rose's parents refused to allow her to enter religious life, and she obeyed them. But then she chose to live as a recluse in a garden shack practicing great austerity, and spending long hours daily in prayer. She did become a member of the Third Order of St. Dominic.

The genuine holiness of this young woman attracted many to her. One writer said of her that we should "remember the greatest thing about her: a love of God so ardent that it withstood ridicule from without, violent temptations and lengthy periods of sickness." During her last years, even though she was ill herself, she cared for homeless children, the elderly, and the sick. She died at the age of 31 in 1617, and was canonized in 1671. She is regarded as the first saint of the Americas and she is honored as the patroness of South America.

St. Rose "gave up everything to devote herself to a life of penance." (Collect of Mass). Rose was graced with many mystical gifts which she humbly received and she was so judged by Inquisitors. She had a profound influence on the spiritual life of her city, where she is greatly revered still today. Who would dare say that she was not led by the grace of God to "her selfless way of life" which seems strange to us perhaps, but not to God?

St. Rose of Lima's appreciation of the role of suffering is revealed in a letter of a Dr. Castillo to whom she wrote: "If only mortals would learn how great it is to possess divine grace, how beautiful, how noble, and how precious. How many riches it hides within itself, how many joys and delights! Without doubt, they would devote all their care and concern to winning for themselves pain and affliction. All men throughout the world would seek trouble, infirmities and torments, instead of good fortune, in order to attain the unfathomable treasure of grace. This is the reward and the final gain of patience. No one would complain about his cross or about troubles that may happen to him, if he would come to know the scales on which they are weighed when they are distributed to men.' (2nd Reading, Liturgy of the Hours).

The spirituality of St. Rose is revealed in these words very well. She was willing to give up all for the love of God with an intensity that we must admire and with a dedication that we can imitate. We can "imitate her selfless way of life on earth" and thus share her blessedness in heaven. (Cf. Collect of Mass).

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT AMENDMENT 4

FLORIDA'S PRO-ABORTION AMENDMENT

What is Amendment 4?

Amendment 4 is a proposed amendment to the Florida Constitution that would essentially establish an unlimited right to abortion throughout pregnancy even when the heartbeat of the preborn child is detected, when the preborn child can experience pain, and when the child is capable of living outside the womb. Amendment 4 will appear on the November 5, 2024 ballot and require approval from 60% of the electorate to pass.

What would Amendment 4 do?

PUT WOMEN AT RISK

Amendment 4 would jeopardize existing laws and prohibit new ones that voters on both sides of the abortion issue support, including health and safety laws that protect women.

ALLOW SECOND AND THIRD TRIMESTER ABORTIONS Though not defined in the amendment, "viability" is defined in Florida law as the stage of development when the life of a fetus is sustainable outside the womb (Ch. 390.011(15)), generally accepted to be 22-24 weeks of pregnancy, or about 6 months.

CREATE A BROAD "HEALTH" LOOPHOLE

"Patient's health" is not defined in the amendment, allowing post-viability, extremely late-term abortions for treatable, temporary health concerns. Emotional health would justify an abortion when a child could survive outside the womb.

WEAKEN MEDICAL DOCTOR REQUIREMENT

"Healthcare providers" – not just physicians – could determine if an abortion is "necessary" to protect the mother's "health." Even some employees of abortion clinics, such as nurses and counselors, could approve late-term abortions.

ELIMINATE PARENTAL CONSENT

While preserving parental notification in our state constitution (Article X, Section 22), the amendment would invalidate the current law that requires parental consent for a minor to have an abortion (Ch. 390.01114(5)), making abortion the only medical decision for which parents have no say.

Would abortion be illegal in Florida if Amendment 4 does not pass?

If Amendment 4 does not pass, abortion would still be legal in Florida until a baby's heartbeat can be detected. Current laws that protect the safety of women would remain in effect.

Doesn't Amendment 4 simply restore Florida back to when Roe v. Wade was in effect?

Amendment 4 goes dangerously beyond what was permitted in the Roe v. Wade ruling. It would eliminate important health and safety measures that protect women, remove parental consent for any minor seeking an abortion, and allow for abortion through the third trimester of pregnancy.

Aren't late term abortions very rare?

Because they are currently not permitted by Florida law, they are extremely rare. There are exceptions in the law that allow late-term abortions to preserve the life of the mother or to avert serious risk of substantial, irreversible impairment of a major bodily function. If Amendment 4 passes, its broad loopholes would allow non-physicians to cite minor, treatable conditions to justify abortions, and there would be many more late-term abortions in Florida.

Will miscarriage care or ectopic pregnancy treatment be denied if Amendment 4 fails?

There is a fundamental difference between an elective abortion and the care provided after a miscarriage or for ectopic pregnancies. Amendment 4 will have no effect on the care a pregnant woman receives in an emergency. Women can always receive necessary and timely lifesaving medical treatment, including in Catholic hospitals. No law restricts this care in Florida.

How is the Church helping pregnant women in need?

The Catholic Church is committed to helping women in need during and after pregnancies. For decades, numerous Catholic social service agencies, in collaboration with faithbased and secular organizations, have assisted pregnant women in need with material resources and personal accompaniment during pregnancy and after their child is born.

What is the Church doing to defeat Amendment 4?

Each diocese in Florida is working together, through the Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops, to help Catholics understand the dangers of Amendment 4 to women, their children and their families. The Church supports the Florida Voters Against Extremism coalition to educate voters on how Amendment 4 is harmful for Floridians.

What can I do to help defeat Amendment 4?

- 1. VOTE NO on Amendment 4
- 2. EDUCATE YOURSELF and TELL OTHERS about the dangers of Amendment 4
- PRAY & Fast






