Grotto Closed for Cleaning


We will be cleaning the entire Grotto area for three days starting on September 3rd. The area will be unavailable for prayer during that time. Thank you!



REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART

"All good giving and every perfect gift is from above." Our Lord is the source of all goodness; therefore, all that flows from the mind, the heart, and the mouth of God is good. In fact, it is all very good as scripture states for God is great and good all the time. All God initiates, all he creates, all he does is very good all of the time. There is no evil, no darkness in God; therefore, all God gives and does, all that he renders, all he permits will bring about good and in his goodness all things will become good again, created in his image and likeness, which again, is simply very good. God is always good and good always. In fact, the word G-o-o-d is just an extension of the name of God and in fact, an extension of God himself for good is from him. God extends his goodness onto us always. Not sometimes or most of the time, as we would like to think or believe, but always. God is always willing and doing good for the sake of the other. The challenge for us is to see how God sees by looking at the goodness in one's own heart. We are encouraged to think only good thoughts, as God only wishes and wills the good for everyone. In God's goodness, we are to love, as God loves goodness and all that is good, for this is very good for you and good for you to do unto others. The good in us however is constantly under attack by the plague of sin and the ugly one. His darkness seeks to twist and distort all that God loves and sees as good. For sin hates what is good, therefore sin hates you. Sin attempts to disfigure and distort all that is good in you. Blessed be God in his goodness for restoring what is hurting, disfigured and distorted in us. Willing the good makes all things new, transfiguring the distortion into something that can be good once again. Unfortunately, at times we see something that is evil as good or worse as a gift. We look at a person's appearance, the outside facade, the outward show, the dazzling appearance as something that would be good for us to have or emulate. We believe being bad can be good sometimes or rendering bad to someone we make an enemy a good thing. Being bad is never good but being good always is God's gracious gift to us.



St. Louis – August 25th



Born in the year 1214, Louis became King of France twenty years later. The greatest influence in his life was his mother, Blanche, who was his regent for eight years after the death of his father. When he reached the age of 20 he was able to assume the throne, and Blanche continued to be his advisor.

Louis' wars and political astuteness are well treated in history books, and are not our concern here. We do associate him with crusades, and he was once and Louis captured ransomed. is remembered however, for his personal piety, his justice and charity, and especially for his lifelong generosity to the poor of his realm. We may note, too, that his nation prospered throughout his fortyfour year reign.

Louis and his wife, Margaret, were the parents of eleven children, all raised and well instructed in the Faith. They were imbued with the principles of the Christian life, mainly by the example of Louis and Margaret, and Louis' mother, Blanche.

In a spiritual testament to his son, we find instruction for all of us: "My first instruction is that you should love the Lord your God with all your heart and all your strength. Without this there is no salvation...Keep yourself from everything that displeases God...If the Lord has permitted you to have some trial, bear it willingly and with gratitude, considering that it has happened for your good. Be kindhearted to the poor, the unfortunate and the afflicted. Give them as much help and consolation as you can. Be just to your subjects. Be devout and obedient to our mother, the Church. Work to remove all sin from your land."

While reading the instruction, we know that St. Louis is teaching from his own life experience. He was pious, prayerful, charitable, and intensely loyal to the Church. This is what we recall about St. Louis, King of France.

He died in 1270, and was canonized in 1297. Spiritual tribute is given to him in the Responsory following the Second Reading in the Liturgy of the Hours:

"He did what was pleasing in the sight of the Lord; among all kings none could compare with him. He was loyal to the Lord and never turned away from Him. The Lord was with him, because he kept the commandments."



Abortion Amendment to Florida's Constitution Vote 'No' on Amendment 4

The Church plays a role in the promotion and attainment of justice and protection of the common good. As faithful citizens, we are called to participate in public life and to apply Gospel values to our political activities. Our actions in the public square must reflect the values of our faith and demonstrate a fundamental belief in the dignity of every person and the sacredness of all human life.

A proposed amendment to our state constitution that seeks to legalize abortion through the third trimester will appear on the November 2024 ballot. While Catholic opposition to abortion is well known, even our friends and neighbors who would tolerate abortion to some degree are finding the proposed amendment too extreme and even deceptive. Let me explain a few key components of the Amendment:

- This amendment was cleverly worded to hide the fact that it would eliminate current laws
 and common-sense safety regulations for abortions that most people on both sides of this
 issue support. For example, while the amendment allows for parental <u>notification</u> before
 a daughter undergoes an abortion, it would eliminate the current law that requires parental
 <u>consent</u>, making this the only medical decision for which parents have no say.
- The amendment explicitly allows abortion until the preborn child is viable, which is at about 22-24 weeks, or 6 months, of pregnancy. It then provides a loophole to allow "health care providers," which under Florida law do not have to be doctors, to justify practically any abortion after that point. Even employees of abortion clinics who are not doctors would be able to approve late-term abortions.
- Unlike other proposed constitutional amendments, the text of the amendment does not
 define key terms like "government interference," "viability," "patient's health" and "health
 care provider." Without these definitions, the amendment, if passed, will cause countless
 lawsuits and years of legal uncertainty.

The bishops of Florida have urged all Floridians to pray for protections for the preborn and mothers in need, and to stand against the legalization of late-term abortion by voting 'no' on Amendment 4.






