

REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART by Fr. Ivan

"Thus says the LORD: Say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not!" One of the things most often in my heart and on my mind these days is listening, truly listening to what the Lord has to say in general or in a particular way to us and what he has to say directly and intimately to me. He is the Word made flesh, the Word among us, the One who said, "Let there be light", and there was, and now he is "the Light of the World." We should listen to him for he truly is God with us, God made visible, the Eucharistic presence of God, that we may truly "taste and see the goodness of the Lord," to "listen to him" and "to do whatever he tells you" to do. What God has said, what God has to say, what God will say and what he will share with you is truly more important than what you have to say or others have to contribute. Take a moment to consider that. It is true. Yes, from time to time we all have something important to say, something we wish to add, something we need to contribute, or something we hope to share and for that, we need a receptive person, a listening ear or perhaps even an ear we can bend. However, what God has to say to you and to others is far more important than what you have to say or share for he is and has "the words of eternal life." What the Lord has to share and what he has to say gives life, saves lives, redeems all creation. If you believe what you have to say is more important than what God has to say or you believe someone else is the way, the truth and the life you choose to resolve your problem or share your gratitude, then you will never hear the Word of God or be able to listen to what he has to say. You will only be able to hear yourself speak and think or listen only to someone else's wisdom that cannot save or redeem you and that is truly a problem. Other than the noisy voice of the enemy, fear is perhaps the biggest contributing factor that drowns out and muffles God's Word in our lives causing it to fall on deaf ears, stiff necks and hearts that have been hurt or hardened overtime. But Jesus says, "Take courage, do not be afraid." Did you hear that?



The Birth of Mary - September 8th



The Second Vatican Council places in perspective all of our honor to Mary. In the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, we read: "Holy Church honors the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with a special love.

She is inseparably linked with her Son's saving work. In her the Church admires and exalts the most excellent fruit of redemption, and joyfully contemplates, as in a faultless image, namely that which she herself desires and hopes wholly to be." (Sacrosanctum Concilium., n. 103).

A short, beautiful reflection on the birth of Mary was written by Eilis Ni Thearnaigh: "Mary is intimately associated with the great feasts of the Annunciation and Christmas when we celebrate the coming into our world of God's own Son. Today's feast, however, celebrates Mary's own coming into the world and the Church is especially joyful. It is the kind of joy all of us feel when looking at the miracle that each new human life is.

This life that is the cause of our joy, is altogether special – in its holiness and human perfection and also in its great potential. Seeing this baby girl and knowing God's choice of her, our joy has a quality of anticipations. We look forward to the day when the baby becomes a young woman who is asked to be the mother of the Savior, Theotokus. So, though it might not at first seem so, this feast is not simply a glorification of Mary herself, but is closely connected with the mystery of our redemption." (Scripture in Church, Vol.18: n. 67 (1987) p. 324).

As a local note, Our Lady of Lourdes Grotto was blessed by our founding pastor, Monsignor Patrick Caverly on this date in 1994, which also happened to be the birthday of his own mother, Mrs. Agnes Caverly, as the bronze plaque on that Marian grotto indicates. It was an unforgettable occasion, as it happened at 7:00 on that Monday evening, in a pouring rainstorm. But none of our spirits were in the least "dampened."

One final prayer: "The birth of the Virgin Mary's Son, was the dawn of our salvation. May this celebration of her birthday bring us closer to lasting peace."



Abortion Amendment to Florida's Constitution Vote 'No' on Amendment 4

The Church plays a role in the promotion and attainment of justice and protection of the common good. As faithful citizens, we are called to participate in public life and to apply Gospel values to our political activities. Our actions in the public square must reflect the values of our faith and demonstrate a fundamental belief in the dignity of every person and the sacredness of all human life.

A proposed amendment to our state constitution that seeks to legalize abortion through the third trimester will appear on the November 2024 ballot. While Catholic opposition to abortion is well known, even our friends and neighbors who would tolerate abortion to some degree are finding the proposed amendment too extreme and even deceptive. Let me explain a few key components of the Amendment:

- This amendment was cleverly worded to hide the fact that it would eliminate current laws and common-sense safety regulations for abortions that most people on both sides of this issue support. For example, while the amendment allows for parental notification before a daughter undergoes an abortion, it would eliminate the current law that requires parental consent, making this the only medical decision for which parents have no say.
- The amendment explicitly allows abortion until the preborn child is viable, which is at about 22-24 weeks, or 6 months, of pregnancy. It then provides a loophole to allow "health care providers," which under Florida law do not have to be doctors, to justify practically any abortion after that point. Even employees of abortion clinics who are not doctors would be able to approve late-term abortions.
- Unlike other proposed constitutional amendments, the text of the amendment does not define key terms like "government interference," "viability," "patient's health" and "health care provider." Without these definitions, the amendment, if passed, will cause countless lawsuits and years of legal uncertainty.

The bishops of Florida have urged all Floridians to pray for protections for the preborn and mothers in need, and to stand against the legalization of late-term abortion by voting 'no' on Amendment 4.
