

REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART

"Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." Listening is such a great challenge for us, yet it is the very thing, the source of our being, what we are most inclined to do. We, all of humanity and all of creation, have been created and instructed to listen attentively to the voice of our Creator, to hear and listen carefully to the visible Word he has sent to us, to listen to with the greatest attention and affection and to the Holy Spirit, the means and grace by how we listen, pray and respond. Responding graciously and respectfully to God and to one another is what we are created and called to do. Perhaps, the very thing our heavenly Father only really asks of us. To love him with all our heart, mind, strength, soul and being by believing and listening to his Only-begotten Son, Jesus, the Good Shepherd who was sent to become a sacrificial peace offering on our behalf in order to raise us in integrity and to newness of life. The challenge is that there is so much to listen to, people, vehicles, nature, enemies, hurts, wounds, pains but the reality is that we should only be listening to one person, God our heavenly Father. His voice is not distracting or a distraction but rather a sweet and soothing sound that remedies noise, is a joyous sound and a melody our heart, mind, body and soul wishes to hear and hopes to listen to, for the voice of the Lord is the sweetest sound to saints and sinners alike. Noise is a distraction, which uses noise as a distraction to distract us. The enemy likes to raise his ugly voice to curse and blaspheme the Holy Name of the Lord. He is that noise, that distraction, always making inappropriate sounds and gestures to distract us for listening to the creative sound and healing voice of the Lord who draws us through beauty, goodness and truth. Whom do you listen to, would rather listen to? Whom do you sound like when you speak? Are your words and the utterances of your heart life giving, lifesaving, life changing, encouraging and inspiring or are your words and the reactions of your thoughts foul, hateful, depleting, hateful? Who sounds like that! Listening to God, the source and nature of all truth sets us free. Listening to lies imprisons us. Speaking untruths is the dark prison of death we need to avoid. We belong to God. The truth we listen to who set us free.



The Breaking of the Oplatek



In many Polish homes throughout the world, a beloved family tradition is the breaking of the oplatek on Christmas Eve. Oplatek is a thin wafer made from flour and water similar in taste and consistency to the hosts that are used for communion during Mass. Oplatki are often stamped with an elaborate Christmas scene.

The oplatek is meant to remind families of the Eucharistic bread at Mass and makes a further connection between Christmas and the gift of the Eucharist, the presence of God among us.

St. Rose Philippine Duchesne

This week's saint is not as well known here in the South, but more so in the Midwest and the Northeast. "No greater saint ever died in Missouri or perhaps in the whole Union," wrote Fr. Pierre de Smet, SJ. He was speaking of St. Rose Philippine Duchesne (1769-1852), a Religious Sister of the Sacred Heart, and a pioneer missionary nun to our Mississippi Valley.

Born in Grenoble, France, she heard as a child stories from a Jesuit missionary to the Louisiana Territory about Indians. From that point on, the desire to work among the Native Americans was kindled. At age 17, she sought to enter the Visitation Convent, but the outbreak of the French Revolution and the expulsion of many Religious men and women from France prevented it. Only years later, at age 33, did she realize her desire to become a nun when she entered the Religious of the Sacred Heart, founded by St. Madeline Sophie Barat.

A few years later, she again became interested in the missions in North America, but it was to be several more years before she was able to lead a group of Sisters to the United States. In 1818, then 49 years old, she arrived in St. Louis, but Bishop Dubourg had no work for them among the Indians. So she and her Sisters settled in St. Louis and established a convent, a school and an for orphanage girls. She was instrumental in founding six other convents along the Mississippi River between St. Louis and New Orleans.

Finally, at age 71 she got her wish and the opportunity to work among the Indians in Sugar Creek, Kansas. In an essay in the journal "Builders of America," Fr. Albert J. Nevins wrote that Mother Duchesne was too old to learn the Potawatomi language, so she spoke in the "international language of kindness and love." Since she could not teach in the native Indian language, she decided to pray for the success of her Sisters' work. She did that for so many long hours every day that the Indians named her "the Woman Who Always Prays," – quite a compliment!

During her last years, despite ill health, she continued to spend many hours in prayer and penitential practices. She died on November 18, 1852 at age of 83, in St. Charles, Missouri. Beatified in 1940, she was canonized by Pope St. John Paul II on July 3, 1988.






