REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART

"Take off your robe of mourning and misery; put on the splendor of glory from God forever." What is the source of your sadness? Is it the lack of not having control, of being out of control or the hurt and disappointment of not getting your way, of things not going your way, of you not getting others to see it your way? What brings you misery, discomfort, bitterness, displeasure? Is it your lack of discipline, your lack of hunger for prayer, the sins you keep excusing, the temptation that never seems to go away? Where is that dark place, the dungeon, you know the secret interior place where you keep all that unforgiveness secretly stored away, the place filled with the pain you suffered others, the place you hide and cannot get to because you lost the key or the way to get there? Jesus came and comes and will come again to heal the broken hearted, strengthen our hearts; empty our hearts from all the suffering and pain so that we do not remember the hurt but the love that Jesus shows us. The Lord came, comes and will come again to liberate those imprisoned by so much stress, so much worry, so much anxiety and so much fear until the day when we finally hear and believe Jesus say, do not worry, do not be afraid, have no anxiety whatsoever. Jesus came, comes and will come again to bring freedom to those oppressed by huge errors of their past life, the major hurts for long ago and the biggest mistakes we cannot seem to let go of. Jesus came, comes and will come again as he does in every Mass and Eucharistic Celebration to bring you blessed hope, joyous peace, the joy of being pardoned, the grace and reconciliation we all need so "Take off your robe of mourning and misery; put on the splendor of glory from God forever." The glory of God is like a transcended light that quietly dispels darkness, error and fear and replaces the voids caused by our mourning, misery and grief with light, love, happiness and endless joy. The glory of God is like living water that washes the stains of sin, worries, cares away and refreshes the parched spirit and soul with the springs of salvation giving it freedom, newness, strength and everlasting peace. The glory of God is the loving embrace of God that covers up our shame and nakedness, warms us after our cold and fills us with life.

Morning Star Catholic School is truly a remarkable place that has a rich history of serving God's children with special needs.

Believing that every child should have the opportunity to learn, former Archbishop Joseph P. Hurley tasked the Sisters of St. Joseph of St. Augustine to

pioneer five Morning Star schools - these became Florida's first schools for children with intellectual disabilities. Under the direction of Sister Elizabeth Marie Stoup, Morning Star Catholic School was officially established in the College Park neighborhood of Orlando in 1960.

Students at Morning Star Catholic School are considered to be intellectually disabled with varying exceptionalities. Intellectual disability is characterized by a significant cognitive impairment combined with limitations in the adaptive skills needed to live, work, and play in the community. Intellectual disabilities can be caused by any condition that impairs development of the brain before birth, during birth, or in childhood years.



The Breaking of the Oplatek



In many Polish homes throughout the world, a beloved family tradition is the breaking of the oplatek on Christmas Eve. Oplatek is a thin wafer made from flour and water similar in taste and consistency to the hosts that are used for communion during Mass. Oplatki are often stamped with an elaborate Christmas scene.

The oplatek is meant to remind families of the Eucharistic bread at Mass and makes a further connection between Christmas and the gift of the Eucharist, the presence of God among us.



Catechism Corner

"Christ not only allows himself to be touched by the sick, but he makes their miseries his own."

2448 "In its various forms - material deprivation, unjust oppression, physical and psychological illness and death - human misery is the obvious sign of the inherited condition of frailty and need for salvation in which man finds himself as a consequence of original sin. This misery elicited the compassion of Christ the Savior, who willingly took it upon himself and identified himself with the least of his brethren. Hence, those who are oppressed by poverty are the object of a preferential love on the part of the Church which, since her origin and in spite of the failings of many of her members, has not ceased to work for their relief, defense, and liberation through numerous works of charity which remain indispensable always and everywhere."



St. Francis Xavier, Priest – December 3

"The Church on earth is by its very nature missionary, since according to the plan of the Father, it has its origin in the mission of the Son and the Holy Spirit. Now what was once preached by the Lord...must be proclaimed and spread to the ends of the earth. Although the obligation of spreading the faith falls individually on every disciple of Christ, still the Lord has called from the number of his disciples those whom He has chosen so that they might be with Him so that he might send them to preach to the nations. "(Decree on the Church's Missionary Activity, Ad Gentes, Nos. 2, 3, & 23).

One of these privileged chosen disciples is St. Francis Xavier. He is the first of the great Jesuit missionaries to the Far East, and the greatest post-apostolic missionary of the Church. He preached the Gospel in India, Malaysia and Japan.

Francis met St. Ignatius at the University of Paris in 1528, was won over by Ignatius and was among the first seven who took vows in the new Society of Jesus founded by Ignatius. This was in 1534. Three years later, he was ordained a priest in Venice together with Ignatius and four others. From there they went to Rome to offer their services to the pope.

In 1541, Francis set out for the East Indies, arriving in Goa in April of that year. He preached first to the Portuguese there and then moved on to South India, later to Malaysia and Japan. Always, as his letters to Ignatius indicate, he went about with enthusiasm and joy. The success of Francis Xavier is legendary.

"I have not stopped since the day I arrived. I conscientiously made the rounds of the villages. I bathed in the sacred waters all the children who had not yet been baptized. This means that I have purified a great number of children so young.

Many, many people hereabouts are not becoming Christians for one reason only: there is nobody to make them Christians." (Letter to St. Ignatius, Cf. 2nd Reading, Liturgy of the Hours).

St. Francis Xavier died on the Island of Sancian off the China coast in 1552.

We cannot all be actual missionaries to the distant lands and peoples who are still in darkness; but through "those whom God has chosen for this very special work the whole community prays, collaborates, and works among the nations." (Ad Gentes, 37).

May we learn from the zeal of St. Francis Xavier so that through us the Church may grow throughout the world. (Cf. Collect of the Mass).



Each year during Advent, we prepare our hearts to celebrate the birth of Christ our Savior at Christmas. As we anticipate this joyful celebration, we recall the well-known journey of the Holy Family from Nazareth to Bethlehem. Far from home, poor, and in great need, Mary and Joseph find refuge in a simple stable. But this humble setting among the livestock soon welcomes the heavenly host of angels and the Son of God himself.

Today, women in our own communities are pregnant, poor, perhaps without a home, and in great need. They may feel alone, scared, and overwhelmed, not knowing where they can turn for help. In challenging circumstances, expectant mothers are in need of a refuge of their own. Like the Holy Family, they are often reliant on the kindness and service of others.

This Advent may the story of the first Christmas inspire us to reach out to mothers in need. May we proactively seek to offer loving support and encouragement as they prepare to welcome their children. By answering this call, may we help mothers experience the joy, hope, and peace brought by the infant Jesus. And may we, too, share in and bear witness to the miracle of new life.
