


REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART



"Why were you looking for me?" At the heart and core of our being is a great need, an aching desire to be heard, understood, respected, received, welcomed and loved. It seems to be at the forefront of our very existence; at the core of our being is the great need that causes us to search for a reason, too long to discover an answer. We spend the day hoping and our time is consumed. We become determined to satisfy this hunger and to achieve the great goal we long to experience. What a blessing it is to encounter a listening someone, a patient ear, the kindness of a person that will welcome and allow us to vent, to share our inner most desires and freedoms. To be able to say what is on our hearts and minds with a gracious listener, a listening person without feeling prejudged or even to experience the emergence of impatience, but rather the kindness of time and patience to have the blessed opportunity to share and discuss your hopes and dreams, your passions and longings, your hurts, sufferings and frustrations. What a blessing it is to be listened to, understood, respected, received and welcomed with such patience and affection as the Lord does for each of us. Jesus experienced this great longing, the searching of a suffering broken heart that prayed that someone would hear and listen to the sorrowful aches of a fallen humanity and entertain the great desire for healing, reconciliation, unity and family once again. It is God's aching desire and humanity's greatest need. From the fall of creation, we looked for Jesus. In the birth of his nativity, shepherds, kings and enemies continued to look for Jesus. The Baptist waited and looked out for him. When the disciples encountered him, Jesus asked them directly, "What are you looking for?" Later, we would even hear the disciples say that our Blessed Mother Mary was outside while the crowds pressed in on Jesus because she also was looking for him. Why are you looking or not looking for Jesus? The crowds longed to see him, kings wished to adore him, shepherds to behold him, people to be near him that he might touch them, understand their great longing and hunger for family, unity and peace. They hoped he would receive them into his heart and home. They welcomed him into their hearts and lives. They were looking for love, light, freedom, healing, life. Pray for an intimate, personal, direct knowledge of Jesus. Without knowing, you've been looking for him.

Catechism Corner

The Eucharist and the Lord's Prayer look eagerly for the Lord's return, "until he comes."

2715 Contemplation is a gaze of faith, fixed on Jesus. "I look at him and he looks at me": this is what a certain peasant of Ars in the time of his holy curé used to say while praying before the tabernacle. This focus on Jesus is a renunciation of self. His gaze purifies heart; the light of countenance of Jesus illumines the eyes of our heart and teaches us to see everything in the light of his truth and his compassion for all men. Contemplation also turns its gaze on the mysteries of the life of Christ. Thus it learns the "interior knowledge of our Lord," the more to love him and follow him.





St. John Damascene, **Priest & Doctor**

The last of the Greek Church Fathers, John (676-749) was born in Damascus, Syria. Well educated in philosophy and theology, John, after some years as a revenue officer in the service of the local governor, became a monk and later was ordained a priest.

In 726 when the veneration of sacred images was prohibited by the Byzantine Emperor Leo, John zealously defended the Catholic position in his writings. That position was that images are a reminder of a saint that one might use during prayer or reflection, but not objects of worship. We honor the saints, but worship and adoration belong to God

He is highly regarded, too, for his systematic treatises, especially for an exposition of the Greek Fathers, used later even in the Western schools. Byzantine liturgical books make use of hymns and canons to honor the Mother of God, and other texts composed by him, such as the Office of the Dead - which the Church still uses on November 2nd, the Commemoration of the Holy Souls, and on Good Friday.

John died in 749 in the Monastery of St. Sabas, near Jerusalem. Pope Leo XIII deservedly declared him a Doctor (Teacher) of the Church in 1890.

Throughout his life, John Damascene (John of Damascus) appreciated his Catholic faith. At the beginning of his Statement of Faith, from which we read today, he wrote:

"Oh Lord, you led me from my father's loins and formed me in my mother's womb. You brought me, a naked babe, into the light of day, for nature's laws always obey your commands.

By the blessing of the Holy Spirit, you prepared my creation and my existence, not because man willed it or flesh desired it, but by your ineffable grace. The birth you prepared for me was such that it surpassed the laws of our nature. You sent me forth into the light by adopting me as your son at Baptism and you enrolled me among the children of your holy and spotless Church." (Cf. 2nd Reading, Liturgy of the Hours).

As a humorous note from my seminary study days, he is also a "patron saint" of frustrated computer operators. Today, we pray that the true faith that St. John Damascene taught so well will always be our light and our strength.

Pope Francis stated in his February 2022 letter announcing the Jubilee 2025: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and farsighted vision. The forthcoming Jubilee can contribute greatly to restoring a climate of hope and trust as a prelude to the renewal and rebirth that we so urgently desire..."

Pope Francis looks ahead to the Jubilee,

praying that it might "strengthen us in the faith," and transform us into "pilgrims of Christian hope"

- In his prayer intention for December, Pope Francis invites us to pray "that this Jubilee strengthen us in our faith, helping us to recognize the Risen Christ in the midst of our lives, transforming us into pilgrims of Christian hope."
- The Pope invites us to be pilgrims of hope in a world that "needs it a lot," and that "through us, let us allow it to reach everyone who is looking for it."
- "Hope," Pope Francis says, "is an anchor an anchor that you cast over with a rope to be moored on the shore. We have to hold onto the rope of hope."

(Vatican City, December 3 2024). – "For pilgrims of hope" is the prayer intention chosen by Pope Francis for the month of December. It is a special invitation within the context of the upcoming Jubilee 2025. For this reason, the Pope asks us to "pray that this upcoming Jubilee strengthen us in our faith, helping us to recognize the Risen Christ in the midst of our lives, transforming us into pilgrims of Christian hope."

The boat and the anchor

In the Statio Orbis during the pandemic in a deserted Saint Peter's Square, Pope Francis used the Gospel metaphor of the boat in the midst of the storm to recall the fragility and disorientation of humanity in the face of great trials. In a certain sense, the Holy Father brings us back to that boat so as to highlight the importance of the anchor in this month's prayer intention. "Hope," he says, accompanying his words with very eloquent gestures, "is an anchor – an anchor that you cast over with a rope to be moored on the shore. We have to hold onto the rope of hope."

In the footsteps of Abraham

"The virtue of hope gives us a lot of strength to walk through life," Pope Francis said on 28 December 2016 during the General Audience dedicated to the figure of Abraham. On the one hand, Abraham was not "afraid to see reality for what it was," and on the other hand, he was capable of "going beyond human reasoning, beyond the world's wisdom and prudence, beyond what was normally considered common sense, to believe in the impossible." Like Abraham, the protagonists of this month's *The Pope Video* set out on a journey, beginning with their own difficulties: the worries of a woman in front of an empty pantry, the doubts of a student regarding the future. (see this month's video on our website) "Day by day, let us fill our lives with the gift of hope that God gives us, and through us, let us allow it to reach everyone who is looking for it," the Pope says in his message that accompanies his prayer intention. And this is exactly what happens to the protagonists in the video: on their journey, both of them meet some "pilgrims of hope" who welcome and comfort them, inviting them to join them on their symbolic journey toward the Holy Door which will remain open during the entire Jubilee year.

Jubilee 2025, whose theme is "Pilgrims of hope", will be a unique moment for celebration and profound reflection. Also called the "Holy Year," it is not only a stop on the journey of faith, but also an invitation to recognize Christ in the everyday.
