REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART

"Who is this king of glory? It is the Lord!" Like so many things in our lives especially those that come from the Lord, a question can be a good thing if it is used in a manner that is helpful and useful to derive goodness. Questions are useful and helpful and something that is ultimately good when it helps develop and determine something that is ultimately good and worthwhile like assisting someone in obtaining knowledge to determine God's plan and God's will in their life. That is a good thing. Like the Lord, a good question begins with a good intention, continues to be and remains good and simply comes to a good, happy ending and never ceases to be a good thing. That is the Lord! Conversely, a question can be malicious in nature and intent. That is the enemy! It can be asked in such a sneaky way and deceptive manner so as to maliciously obtain information that is highly private and confidential and super sensitive in nature that can then be used for ill or to hurt another's good reputation and damage that person's good image or destroy their good name. This type of question may seem to be good on the surface but wrapped and disguised in maliciousness it does not continue to be good and ultimately seeks the demise of an individual. This type of question can be asked and stated in such a manner as to confuse, deceive or trip someone up to gain an unfair advantage for self-profit or to do harm to another or simply lead or cause another to sin. That is a sinner's malicious evil intent and the Devil is the master of evil intentions. He is the master of deception and deceit. He uses questions and questioning to question God's power and authority and even to undermine who we are as beloved children of God. The Devil uses questioning to cause us to question our own identity and that of every other person created and formed in the image and likeness of God. He uses questions to confuse us, deceive us and lie to us. He shrouds what appears to be good but underneath all the dazzling shining bling is a snare and a trap to cause us to question God's good love and his loving intention. Like what the enemy did to Adam and Eve, constantly causing them to question what God said to undermine his love; we too can falsely believe a lie and question God's good intention and love for us.

Catechism Corner

"Teacher, what good deed must I do, to have eternal life?"

385 God is infinitely good and all his works are good. Yet no one can escape the experience of suffering or the evils in nature which seem to be linked to the limitations proper to creatures: and above all to the question of moral evil. Where does evil come from? "I sought whence evil comes and there was no solution", said St. Augustine, and his own painful quest would only be resolved by his conversion to the living God. For "the mystery of lawlessness" is clarified only in the light of the "mystery of our religion". The revelation of divine love in Christ manifested at the same time the extent of evil and the superabundance of grace. We must therefore approach the question of the origin of evil by fixing the eyes of our faith on him who alone is its conqueror.

Words to Live By

No one ought to rely on his own feelings when he speaks out, nor be confident in his own strength when he undergoes temptation. For whenever we speak prudently as we should, our wisdom comes from Him, and whenever we endure evils courageously, our long suffering comes from Him.


Mass of Remembrance

St. Thomas Aquinas, Priest and Doctor of the Church

In St. Thomas Aquinas "the Middle Ages reached its full flowering and Christianity received its most towering influential intellect." (J. Delaney, Dictionary of the Saints, p. 553). From the same source, Thomas has also been called "the preeminent spokesman of the Catholic tradition of reason and of Divine Revelation."

Born in 1225, Thomas was sent at age five to the Benedictine Abbey of Monte Casino. His mother hoped that he would one day become the abbot. However, Thomas later chose to join the Dominicans, also known as the Order of Preachers, in 1244 over the objections of his family. He completed his studies under St. Albert the Great and was ordained a priest at Cologne, Germany in 1248. For the next several years he taught in Paris, Rome, Naples and other cities, but his greatest contribution to the Church are his philosophical and theological writings.

In the pursuit of knowledge, he taught that faith and reason help us to arrive at certain conclusions. In the Summa Theologica he wrote: "We must say that for the knowledge of any truth whatsoever man needs divine help. But he does not need a new light added to his natural light, in order to know the truth in all things, but only for those that surpass his natural knowledge." (I-II, 109, 1)

St. Thomas saw Christ on the Cross as an example of love and of patience in suffering. He was an example of humility in submitting to the judgment of Pilate, and in obeying the will of his Father.

The asceticism of St. Thomas Aquinas can be appreciated as he continues in this commentary:

"If you seek an example of despising earthly things, follow him who is the King of kings and the Lord of lords, in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. Upon the cross he was stripped, mocked, spat upon, struck, crowned with thorns, and given only vinegar and gall to drink."

"Do not be attached, therefore, to clothing and riches, because they divided my garments among themselves. Nor to honors, for I experienced harsh words and scourgings. Nor to greatness of rank, for weaving a crown of thorns they placed it on my head. Nor to anything delightful, for in my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink."

He was very learned, yet he was also a man of great humility and holiness. Thomas Aquinas continues to teach us by his word and example. He is the patron of universities, colleges and schools. Thomas died in 1274, was canonized in 1323, and proclaimed Doctor (Teacher) of the Church by Pope Pius V in 1567.

Through his intercession we pray that we may "grow in wisdom by his teaching, and in holiness by imitating his faith." (Opening Prayer of Mass).

The Universal Church celebrates the Jubilee Year 2025 ~ the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord.

Did you know that Plenary Indulgences are available during this Jubilee Year?

What is an indulgence?

Even though confessed and forgiven sins will not send a person to hell, consequences remain to be paid on earth or in purgatory. An indulgence frees the recipient from those consequences. Reception of an indulgence always springs from sincere repentance, the desire to live a holy life, reception of the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion as soon as possible and prayer for the Holy Father. An indulgence cannot be bought, nor can one be obtained by going through the motions without sincerity.

A partial indulgence covers part of the punishment due for sins; a plenary indulgence removes all of it. Both kinds of indulgence come from the merits of Jesus, the Blessed Mother and the saints. These "merits" are the opposite of "demerits." They are spiritual fruits accumulated through holy living. To grant indulgences, the Church draws on a great treasury of merits: the infinite value of Christ's Passion, death and Resurrection, and the prayers and good works of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the saints – including all of those on earth who live holy lives.

This year, the faithful, 'pilgrims of hope', will be able to obtain the Indulgence by undertaking a pilgrimage to any sacred Jubilee site (we have three in the Diocese of Orlando), to at least one of the four Major Papal Basilicas of Rome, to the Holy Land or to other designated ecclesiastical sites, and taking part in a moment of prayer, a liturgical celebration or celebrating the sacrament of reconciliation. The indulgence can also be obtained by 'devoutly visiting any Jubilee site' and taking part in Eucharistic adoration or meditation, concluding with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith, and appropriate invocations to Mary. (more coming next week on obtaining an indulgence through 'works of mercy and penance'.)

Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops urges Gov. De Santis to spare life of James Ford



"We mourn the tragic deaths of Mr. and Mrs. Malnory and the suffering of their daughter, family, and friends, and we pray for their comfort," wrote Michael Sheedy in a letter to the Governor. "It is indeed a duty of the state to protect the lives and safety of its citizens and to impose appropriate punishment for crimes, and we recognize your responsibility in ensuring this duty is carried out." 


