

"By the grace of God I am what I am." Once a spiritual formator suggested to me and everyone he was spiritually directing in the Exercises of Saint Ignatius to look into a mirror until Christ became more interesting than I am. So as awkward and daring as it sounds, I did the exercise with serious intent and a hope for a positive desired outcome. What I encountered or rather, more accurately said is, whom I encountered was not what I expected to experience but even greater is to experience the great I AM in the very person that I am gazing upon me in the mirror. Not a conceited look or glance nor an overly critical stare or gaze but a true deep encounter of staring into the deep open space that lies beyond a look or a stare into an interior beholding that is not possible without something or someone to reflect. As I began to look, I began to notice that someone else was looking, gazing, and beholding me with my own eyes. I am not certain that I ever really noticed how beautiful God looks at us when he looks upon us with our own eyes. Try it. Do not be afraid or become overly self-conscious, selfcentered or afraid that someone will see you. Be open and see you as you truly are for the first time. It is not silly but mostly important to note God does not look at you through your outward appearance. He is not looking or staring at your perfect or imperfect eyebrows or at your gorgeous hairstyle or facial blemishes, neither is God looking or starring at your ears or earrings or your nose or nose rings. God is looking directly at you not from the outside, but from the inside and he likes and loves what he sees. Focusing all your intention and energy, being quiet, still and focused do not look at your eyes but rather look into your eyes. Look deep into your eyes and begin to notice how God uses your own eyes to look at you and notice how beautiful he sees what he sees. Who you are, meaning the person you really are, that beautiful person God so graciously created in his beautiful image and in his beautiful likeness, that person cannot be covered up by worldly materials or exotic paints or fake costume jewelry or fancy hats, masks or gloves. No, by the grace of God you are who you are and that is wonderful in God's eyes.



## St. Ansgar, Bishop

St. Ansgar (801-865), a ninth century Benedictine monk and bishop, was born in Amiens, France. His missionary work was in Denmark after the conversion of King Harold. He was invited also to Sweden where he remained a short time. Then, he was recalled to become the abbot of a new monastery and Archbishop of Hamburg, Germany in 831. He was named legate to Scandinavia, and for the next fourteen years labored there only to see all his work come to naught because of the destructive invasions of the Norsemen. He returned to Germany in 854 and then nine years later returned to Denmark and Sweden. He experienced some success there, but the whole area lapsed into paganism after his death.

Ansgar is remembered as an extraordinary preacher, a humble, ascetical priest and a bishop, who was greatly concerned for the poor and the sick. Miracles accompanied his missionary work, but he thought little of them. He said that he would ask of God only one miracle, "that by his grace he would make of me a good man."

He was untiring in his missionary efforts and often prayed for a martyr's crown. He often endured hardships from hostile pirates and marauding tribes. His death, however, was a peaceful one and he died in Bremen, Germany, in 865.

The zeal of St. Ansgar and the many missionaries like him, both past and present, continues to be a source of inspiration for us. As they responded to the call of God, so must we. The Second Vatican Council in the Decree of the Church's Missionary Activity reminds us:

"Every disciple of Christ is responsible in his own measure for the spread of the faith, but Christ the Lord is always calling from among his followers those whom he wills, so that they may be with him and be sent by him to preach to the nations. In preaching the Gospel to the nations he must boldly proclaim the mystery of Christ and not be ashamed of the scandal of the cross. He must follow in the footsteps of the Master, who was gentle and humble of heart, and reveal to others that his yoke is easy and his burden light." (Ad Gentes. Nos. 23-24).

St. Ansgar preached courageously and bravely overcame difficulties, disappointments and hardships. During all of this he persevered to "bring the light of Christ to many nations." (Collect of Mass).

# Did you know that Plenary Indulgences are available during this Jubilee Year? What is an indulgence?

Even though confessed and forgiven sins will not send a person to hell, consequences remain to be paid on earth or in purgatory. An indulgence frees the recipient from those consequences. Reception of an indulgence always springs from sincere repentance, the desire to live a holy life, reception of the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion as soon as possible and prayer for the Holy Father. An indulgence cannot be bought, nor can one be obtained by going through the motions without sincerity.

A partial indulgence covers part of the punishment due for sins; a plenary indulgence removes all of it. Both kinds of indulgence come from the merits of Jesus, the Blessed Mother and the saints. These "merits" are the opposite of "demerits." They are spiritual fruits accumulated through holy living. To grant indulgences, the Church draws on a great treasury of merits: the infinite value of Christ's Passion, death and Resurrection, and the prayers and good works of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the saints – including all of those on earth who live holy lives.

This year, the faithful, 'pilgrims of hope', will be able to obtain the indulgence by undertaking a pilgrimage to any sacred Jubilee site, to at least one of the four Major Papal Basilicas of Rome, to the Holy Land or to other designated ecclesiastical sites, and taking part in a moment of prayer, a liturgical celebration or celebrating the sacrament of reconciliation. The indulgence can also be obtained by 'devoutly visiting any Jubilee site' and taking part in Eucharistic adoration or meditation, concluding with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith, and appropriate invocations to Mary.

Another way to obtain indulgence will be through 'works of mercy and penance', with which a person's conversion is manifested. The faithful 'following the example and mandate of Christ', are encouraged to carry out works of charity or mercy more frequently, mainly in the service of those brothers and sisters who are burdened by various needs. Likewise, they may obtain the indulgence by visiting those 'who are in need or difficulty (the sick, prisoners, the lonely elderly, the disabled...), 'in a sense making a pilgrimage to Christ present in them.'

The 'penitential spirit', notes the Norms, is 'the soul of the Jubilee' and therefore the indulgence can also be obtained by 'abstaining, in a spirit of penance, at least for one day of the week from futile distractions (real but also virtual distractions), from superfluous consumption as well as by donating a proportionate sum of money to the poor; by supporting works of a religious or social nature, especially in support of the defense and protection of life in all its phases.'


May your grace transform us into tireless cultivators of the seeds of the Gospel.
