

REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART

"The first man, Adam, became a living being, the last Adam a life-giving spirit." These recent days and certainly in the most recent of times, I seem to be contemplating, remaining joyfully in thought but really truly and seriously pondering and thinking about the gracious gift of God's grace, the precious gift of the breath of life and the amazing gracious gift of all creation. Imagine, God simply forming out of nothing, creating from nothing that ever existed before and doing so with such great love and spiritual precision the very breath of creation and the amazing way God created all that is very good, beautiful in nature and simply true in being. Catechism Corner

Creation is the foundation of "all God's saving plans," the "beginning of the history of salvation" that culminates in Christ.

299 Because God creates through wisdom, his creation is ordered: "You have arranged all things by measure and number and weight." The universe, created in and by the eternal Word, the "image of the invisible God", is destined for and addressed to man, himself created in the "image of God" and called to a personal relationship with God. Our human understanding, which shares in the light of the divine intellect, can understand what God tells us by means of his creation, though not without great effort and only in a spirit of humility and respect before the Creator and his work. Because creation comes forth from God's goodness, it shares in that goodness - "And God saw that it was good. . . very good"- for God willed creation as a gift addressed to man, an inheritance destined for and entrusted to him. On many occasions the Church has had to defend the goodness of creation, including that of the physical world.


Mass of Remembrance

Seven Founders of the **Order of Servites**

Between the years 1225 and 1227, seven young men of prominent Florentine families (Buonfiglio Monaldo, Alexis Falconieri, Benedict dell Antella, Bartholomew Amidei, Ricovero Uguccione, Gerardino Sostegni, and John Buonagiunta) met together out of their desire to live a life of special devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

They came to understand through prayer and spiritual direction as well as a revelation from the Virgin Mary, that they were chosen "to be her servants...and to follow the Rule of St. Augustine." They became known as the Servites or Servants of Marv.

After several years of life in solitude and prayer, at the wish of their bishop, six of them were ordained as priests, while Alexis humbly begged to remain a brother. The new community adopted a form of religious life after the Mendicants (begging orders), and their numbers rapidly increased. They began to engage in the active ministries of teaching and preaching in parish-based ministry. All seven cofounders remained very active throughout their lives. Alexis supposedly lived to the age of 110.

The thirteenth century was a time of introspection in the Church. It was a restless time, and a time of change. There was an awareness that reform and change were needed. The impetus for much of this came from the mendicant orders that were founded in this century: the Franciscans, Dominicans, Carmelites, Augustinians, and Servites. The Fourth Lateran Council in 1215, which also decreed priestly celibacy for Roman rite priests, began the effort to revitalize doctrine and discipline. The Mendicant orders were effective in assisting in these areas, and the Servites were numbered among them.

The Church is aware that religious orders and congregations have a prophetic role (by words and actions they proclaim the Good News), as should we. This is noted in the Second Vatican Council's documents, speaking in the present, but also in recognition of the past. The Council stated in the Constitution on the Church that "the Church will ensure the establishment of religious institutes to build up the Body of Christ" (Cf. n. 45). In an exhortation in 1971 to religious orders we read also:

"The charism of the religious life far from being an impulse born of flesh and blood, or one derived from a mentality which conforms itself to the modern world, is the fruit of the Holy Spirit, who is always at work within the Church." (Evangelica Testificatio n. 11).

Each year on February 17th, with the exception of those dates which fall on Sundays, we honor these seven saints, filled with Love, inspired by God's grace to honor our Holy Mother with special devotion, who had the courage and vision to give themselves to the work of building up the Body of Christ. Their work continues today in the religious community they founded, the Servants of Mary, as they continue to lead people to God.


An American Blessed


