

#### What are Scrutinies?

The Scrutinies are important and special rites of the Church celebrated on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent, by those people who are preparing to be baptized at Easter, known as "The Elect". The Scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life. The Gospels, from the "A" cycle, on the three Sundays on which the Scrutinies are celebrated teach the elect about the mystery of sin, and fill them with the Spirit of Christ. **Thank you for keeping our Elect in your prayers.** 



#### REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART

"Whoever thinks he is standing secure should take care not to fall." Sometimes our vision is off. Way off. We fail to see things clearly, accurately. We fail to visualize things as they really are. Perhaps our eyesight has double vision or easily blind sighted or sees things as stick figures, outlines or silhouettes and yet we are sure about what we see. Certain about what we saw. Sin causes us to lose perspective, to misjudge distances, to miscount items or even add items that are not there or miss or omit necessary and important details that are actually present. Sin causes us to look away or to look elsewhere. To look around to find traces of evidence that is nonexistent or obtain something fraudulently. To look for things that are not there or mysteriously have things appear when no one is looking. Perhaps things that were never there or to see things not as they are or ever were. At times, our vision is so bad; we tend to have false images of ourselves. We see ourselves through negative impressions of ourselves and make comparisons to others. The wooden beam in our eye gets in the way and prevents us to be able to see the full picture clearly as the scene is or the picture meant to be. Envy, ambition, jealousy affect our vision and damage our eyesight. Our focus is blurred, our eyesight skewed. We can be nearsighted and overly critical of others and ourselves. Other times, we are rather farsighted. We inflate the facts and over exaggerate the details. Either way, our vision is poor, our eyesight impaired and we see what we want to see rather than what really is. Our eyesight becomes like judgement and our judgement becomes our vision. Sometimes we just get it wrong. Some see the glass half empty. Others see the glass half full. Still others cannot even see the glass. Still others fail to see there is nothing in it at all. We see and look at only the appearance and not really the appearance but our wounded self, projected onto another. We see what hurts inside transferred and projected onto what or who we see. We measure our vision by what we see rather than what really is. We stand falsely secure only to see how we fail to see and fall into sin. Praise God he sees you. He sees all of you and still likes what he sees. Be gentle with yourselves and others for God is gentle and kind.



Latisha's House provides a long-term, transitional housing program for adult, female survivors of human trafficking and offers individualized support to empower them to build a bridge from their traumatic past to a positive future. Visit www.annunciationorlando.org/lent to make a donation or use the blue collection envelopes and write Latisha's House in the memo.

The local Latisha's House serves all of Central Florida including survivors from Seminole County. Survivors live on the local Latisha's House campus for an average of 18 to 24 months at no cost to them. "The mental bondage and manipulation many survivors have had to deal with for years makes it tough to go from being forcefully dependent on someone to independent living," explains Stephanie O'Connor, the Director of Development and Outreach for Latisha's House Florida. "The reality is that, like victims of domestic violence, a survivor may go back multiple times before the final straw. We do our best to help connect these women to the services they need and be the last stop for them, once and for all."

Latisha's House connects survivors with local healthcare providers and offers financial education, vocational guidance, and skills training. The team also supports women seeking to reunite with their families. Rooted in Christian principles, the faith-led organization welcomes all, regardless of belief.





#### St. Patrick, Bishop

Details of St. Patrick's life are few and uncertain, though legends abound. Patrick was born in Scotland, England, or perhaps Gaul (France) in the year 385. Along with some slaves of his father, he was captured and taken to Ireland and sold as a slave. However, he escaped to Gaul and made his way back home. His preparations for priesthood seemed to be in Gaul, at Lerins. He was ordained in 417 and remained in Gaul for fifteen years.

Consecrated a bishop in 432, he went to Ireland and began to preach throughout the country, with great success. In his "Confessions, he wrote: "I came to the Irish people to preach the Gospel and to endure the taunts of unbelievers putting up with reproaches about my earthly pilgrimage, suffering many persecutions, even bondage, and losing my birthright of freedom for the benefit of others. If I am worthy, I am ready also to give up my life without hesitation and most willingly, for His Name."

Patrick made himself one of the people, he lived simply, learned their language and customs, and respected their religious genius. The people, for their part, were open to him and his challenging preaching. Patrick's efforts were so successful that within a century Irish monks were Christianizing Europe, and introducing what he called spiritual direction, but really it was the first individual confession, soon to become very popular. The foundation of St. Patrick's strength was a deep sense of the presence of God and his constant prayer.

The "Breastplate of St. Patrick" prayer is attributed to him: "May the strength of God guide me this day, and may His power preserve me. May the wisdom of God instruct me; the eye of God watch over me; the ear of God hear me; the Word of God give sweetness to my speaking. The hand of God defend me, and may I follow the way of God. Christ be with me, Christ before me, Christ be after me, Christ within me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me. Christ at my right hand, Christ at my left. Christ in the fort, Christ in the chariot, Christ in the ship. Christ in the heart of every man who thinks of me, Christ in the mouth of every man who speaks to me; Christ in the eye that sees me; Christ in the ear that hears me."

The how and the why of missionary activity was understood by St. Patrick and other pioneer missionary monks; they were stalwart heralds of the Gospel. What we learned from them is acknowledged by the Second Vatican Council in the Decree on the Church's Missionary Activity. "They (and pioneers like St. Patrick), established the Church to offer all men the mystery of salvation and the life brought by God."

St. Patrick lived with the people and ever so gently brought them to Faith, challenging them to grow in knowledge and experience. Because of the island's pagan background, Patrick dealt with practical challenges, including the encouragement of widows to remain chaste, unless they remarried, and young women to dedicate their virginity to God. When one considers the enormity of the mission he undertook, with its conversion of vast numbers of people to the Faith, he must have been a pretty dynamic person, and one whose holiness made an impression. The Holy Spirit multiplied and blessed his mission many times over.

While it may be legend that St. Patrick drove all the snakes out of Ireland, his simple teaching on the Trinity, using the three leaves of the shamrock was highly effective. Patrick departed the "land of saints and scholars" in the year 493.
