

What are Scrutinies?

The Scrutinies are important and special rites of the Church celebrated on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent, by those people who are preparing to be baptized at Easter, known as "The Elect". The Scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life. The Gospels, from the "A" cycle, on the three Sundays on which the Scrutinies are celebrated teach the elect about the mystery of sin, and fill them with the Spirit of Christ. **Thank you for keeping our Elect in your prayers.**

REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART

"God has reconciled us to himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation." Left to myself and given an honest reflection and a true assessment of myself, my skill sets, the things that I can truly claim as my own, I consider what can I truly do or accomplish on my own, left to myself with no assistance from God. What would I be able to create, build, transform, transcend, or serve by my own gifts, treasures or talents that I have won, gained or obtained on my own without any help or assistance from God or from anyone else? We need God to love, to breathe, to see, to think, to smell, to speak, to die, to live and to live forever. The first and only thought that arises is sin. I think to myself, I do not need God for that. However, in pondering further how I can and have the ability and the potential to sin, be tempted, cause hurt, distress and chaos, I ultimately realize, in a sense, I need God for that as well. For unless God created me out of nothing and in his own divine image and likeness and granted me the breath and gift of life and the grace and freedom of free will, I would not be able to sin, for I would not exist or have the freedom to do so. Crazy is it not? Yet sinning is in no way God's fault although like Adam, we tend to accuse God for our bad mistakes and poor choices. Sin should not and could never be God's fault or in any way attributed to God. Sin is a direct and intentional misuse of the powers, the abilities, the gifts and glories God has chosen to freely give and gift his beautiful chosen creation. God freely and lovingly has given us free choice and therefore the power to choose good over evil in all that we think, say and do. We need to choose freely not to sin or cause hurt, or cause others to stress or create any sort of chaos because we are created and recreated to avoid evil. We simply are created very good to be very good often and always. Since we can do nothing without God, we needed God to send Jesus to reconcile us to the Father and to one another and even needed Jesus to help us to forgive ourselves. God does not need us; however, gracious is he to permit us to help him to help ourselves.

Latisha's House provides a long-term, transitional housing program for adult, female survivors of human trafficking and offers individualized support to empower them to build a bridge from their traumatic past to a positive future. Visit www.annunciationorlando.org/lent to make a donation or use the blue collection envelopes and write Latisha's House in the memo.

The local Latisha's House serves all of Central Florida including survivors from Seminole County. Survivors live on the local Latisha's House campus for an average of 18 to 24 months at no cost to them. "The mental bondage and manipulation many survivors have had to deal with for years makes it tough to go from being forcefully dependent on someone to independent living," explains Stephanie O'Connor, the Director of Development and Outreach for Latisha's House Florida. "The reality is that, like victims of domestic violence, a survivor may go back multiple times before the final straw. We do our best to help connect these women to the services they need and be the last stop for them, once and for all."

Latisha's House connects survivors with local healthcare providers and offers financial education, vocational guidance, and skills training. The team also supports women seeking to reunite with their families. Rooted in Christian principles, the faith-led organization welcomes all, regardless of belief.




CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

Catechism Corner

"Reconciliation with God leads, as it were, to other reconciliations, which repair the other breaches caused by sin."

1469 This sacrament reconciles us with the Church. Sin damages or even breaks fraternal communion. The sacrament of Penance repairs or restores it. In this sense it does not simply heal the one restored to ecclesial communion, but has also a revitalizing effect on the life of the Church which suffered from the sin of one of her members. Re-established or strengthened in the communion of saints, the sinner is made stronger by the exchange of spiritual goods among all the living members of the Body of Christ, whether still on pilgrimage or already in the heavenly homeland.

Pillars of Faith ** By Fr. Stephen Baumann

The Annunciation of the Lord

The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord goes back to the fourth or fifth century. Its central focus is the Incarnation: God has become one of us. From all eternity, God had decided that the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity should become human. Now as Luke 1:26-28 tells us, that decision is being realized. The God-Man embraces all humanity, indeed all creation, to bring it to God in one great act of love. Because human beings have rejected God, Jesus will accept a life of suffering and an agonizing death: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." (John 15:13).


Mary has an important role to play in God's plan. From all eternity God destined her to be the mother of Jesus and closely related to Him in the creation and redemption of the world. We could say that God's decrees of creation and redemption are joined in the decree of Incarnation. As Mary is God's instrument in the Incarnation, she has a role to play with Jesus in creation and redemption. It is a God-given role. It is God's grace from beginning to end. Mary becomes the eminent figure she is, only by God's grace. She is the empty space where God could act. Everything she is she owes to the Blessed Trinity.

She is the virgin-mother who fulfills Isaiah 7:14 in a way that Isaiah could not have imagined. She is united with her Son in carrying out the will of God (Psalm 40:89; Hebrews 10:7-9; Luke 1:38).

Together with Jesus, the privileged and graced Mary is the link between heaven and earth. She is the human being who best, after Jesus, exemplifies the possibilities of human existence. She received into her lowliness the infinite love of God. She shows how an ordinary human being can reflect God in the ordinary circumstances of life. She exemplifies what the church and every member of the church is meant to become. She is the ultimate product of the creative and redemptive power of God. She manifests what the Incarnation is meant to accomplish for all of us.

Sometimes spiritual writers are accused of putting Mary on a pedestal and thereby discouraging ordinary humans from imitating her. Perhaps such an observation is misguided. God did put Mary on a pedestal and has put all human beings on a pedestal. We have scarcely begun to realize the magnificence of divine grace, the wonder of God's freely given love. The marvel of Mary – even in the midst of her very ordinary life – is God's shout to us to wake up to the marvelous creatures that we all are by divine design.

"Enriched from the first instant of her conception with the splendor of an entirely unique holiness, the virgin of Nazareth is hailed by the heralding angel, by divine command, as 'full of grace' (CF. Luke 1:28). To the heavenly messenger she replies: 'Behold the handmaid of the Lord: be it done to me according to thy word' (Luke 1:38). Thus the daughter of Adam, Mary, consenting to the word of God, became the Mother of Jesus. Committing herself wholeheartedly and impeded by no sin to God's saving will, she devoted herself totally, as a handmaid of the Lord, to the person and work of her Son, under and with Him, serving the mystery of redemption, by the grace of Almighty God" (Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, 56).
