The Scrutinies are important and special rites of the Church celebrated on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent, by those people who are preparing to be baptized at Easter, known as "The Elect". The Scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life. The Gospels, from the "A" cycle, on the three Sundays on which the Scrutinies are celebrated teach the elect about the mystery of sin, and fill them with the Spirit of Christ. **Thank you for keeping our Elect in your prayers.**

REFLECTIONS FROM THE HEART

"Remember not the events of the past, the things of long ago consider not; see, I am doing something new!" At times, we seek and speak of things in such broad and general terms that the words seem to be lost in translation or become watered down in transmission or the purpose of its intention seems to be softened. It then has little or no effect or impact. We tend to say things like, "that always happens to me" or "I never did this or that". However, if we take a closer look and consider a specific incident or a particular time in our life prior to a change or conversion, then we most likely cannot say that we never or always do this or that but simply did just that one time. Whenever we try to oversimplify or understate words, terms or situations by using general or broad terms, we can fail to see a particular moment in time that can or should implicate and include ourselves. We tend to overgeneralize our opinions and beliefs of ourselves and of others. We say things like, "those people always are typically a particular way" or we place our emphasis on a particular group by stating they, meaning all of them, will never understand this or that without considering the majority, the minority or the exception to the rule. Jesus came in Spirit and Truth and continues to come in Word and Sacrament to make all things new. It is not a broad or general statement but true in nature and accurate in fact. Jesus came and continues to come to restore all things, renew all people, recover all that was lost and renew all things in and through himself. Jesus does not come to change us but rather to renew us. To make us new and whole once again. Change in general terms describes a conversion. When change occurs, something is different like when Jesus changed water into wine or when Satan asked Jesus to turn a stone into bread. However, Jesus is doing something new, something different. His generous call to conversion is for the person to turn around, stop heading in the wrong direction, and make a full return to the Lord. Rather than changing you into a different person, Jesus returns you through the waters of baptism, cleansing you from old and evil recovering what was lost through disobedience and sin, restoring you to the divine image, likeness and friendship of God. Renewing your life by his, back to being you again.

THE PASSION OF THE LORD

Fasting & Abstinence Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all 18 years of age and older who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Abstinence is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and on all other Fridays of Lent by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Remember: If your health or your ability to work would be seriously affected, fasting or abstinence does not apply.


Latisha's House provides a long-term, transitional housing program for adult, female survivors of human trafficking and offers individualized support to empower them to bridge from their traumatic past to a positive future. www.annunciationorlando.org/lent to make a donation or use the blue collection envelopes and write Latisha's House in the memo.

The local Latisha's House serves all of Central Florida including survivors from Seminole County. Survivors live on the local Latisha's House campus for an average of 18 to 24 months at no cost to them. "The mental bondage and manipulation many survivors have had to deal with for years makes it tough to go from being forcefully dependent on someone to independent living," explains Stephanie O'Connor, the Director of Development and Outreach for Latisha's House Florida. "The reality is that, like victims of domestic violence, a survivor may go back multiple times before the final straw. We do our best to help connect these women to the services they need and be the last stop for them, once and for all."

Latisha's House connects survivors with local healthcare providers and offers financial education, vocational guidance, and skills training. The team also supports women seeking to reunite with their families. Rooted in Christian principles, the faith-led organization welcomes all, regardless of belief.

Catechism Corner

""This new life as a child of God can be weakened and even lost by sin."

654The Paschal mystery has two aspects: by his death, Christ liberates us from sin; by his Resurrection, he opens for us the way to a new life. This new life is above all justification that reinstates us in God's grace, "so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life." Justification consists in both victory over the death caused by sin and a new participation in grace. It brings about filial adoption so that men become Christ's brethren, as Jesus himself called his disciples after his Resurrection: "Go and tell my brethren." We are brethren not by nature, but by the gift of grace, because that adoptive filiation gains us a real share in the life of the only Son, which was fully revealed in his Resurrection.



St. Francis of Paola, Hermit - April 2nd

Francis of Paola (1416-1507) was a man who deeply loved contemplative solitude and wished only to be the "least in the household of God." Yet, when the church called him to active service in the world, he became a miracle-worker and influenced the course of nations. After accompanying his parents on a pilgrimage to Rome and Assisi, he began to live as a contemplative hermit in a remote cave near Paola, on Italy's southern seacoast.


Before he was twenty, he received the first followers who had come to imitate his way of life. Seventeen years later, when his disciples had grown in number, Francis established a Rule for his austere community and sought church approval. This was the founding of the Hermits of Saint Francis of Assisi, who were approved by the Holy See in 1474.

In 1492, Francis changed the name of his community to "Minims" because he wanted them to be known as the least (minimi) in the household of God. Humility was to be the hallmark of the brothers as it had been in Francis' personal life. Besides the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience, Francis enjoined upon his followers the fourth obligation of a perpetual Lenten fast. He felt that heroic mortification was necessary as a means for spiritual growth.

It was Francis' desire to be a contemplative hermit, yet he believed that God was calling him to the apostolic life. He began to use the gifts he had received, such as the gifts of miracles and prophecy, to minister to the people of God. A defender of the poor and oppressed, Francis incurred the wrath of King Ferdinand of Naples for the admonitions he directed towards the king and his sons.

Following the request of Pope Sixtus IV, Francis traveled to Paris to help King Louis XI of France prepare for his death. While ministering to the king, Francis was able to influence the course of national politics. He helped to restore peace between France and Brittany by advising a marriage between the ruling families, and between France and Spain by persuading Louis XI to return some disputed land. Francis died while at the French court.

The life of St. Francis of Paola speaks plainly to an overactive world. He was a contemplative man called to active ministry and must have felt keenly the tension between prayer and service. Yet in Francis' life, it was a productive tension, for he clearly utilized the fruits of contemplation in this ministry, which came to involve the workings of nations. He responded so readily and so well to the call of the church from a solid foundation in prayer and mortification. When he went out to the world, it was not he who worked but Christ working through him – "the least in the household of God."
