REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

In our parable for today, we have the witness of a widow who came to a dishonest judge and continuously begged him for a just judgment. Though the judge did not care about the woman, he eventually rendered a just decision for her because she was so persistent. It's interesting that Jesus used the image of a "dishonest judge" to teach us about persistent prayers being answered. He does so because He wants us to understand that if even those who are dishonest respond to persistence, then so much more will the Just Judge of Heaven respond to persistence.

Will God answer any prayer you pray if you offer that prayer day and night, day after day without fail? Does God eventually give into our requests as a parent might give into a child who keeps begging for something? Not exactly. One of the most important qualifiers mentioned in this parable is the word "just." We read that the woman's plea before the judge was, "render a just decision for me..." At the conclusion of the parable, Jesus gives this interpretation: "Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night?" When we pray, we ought not pray for whatever we want. We ought not pray for our preference, selfish desires, or our own ideas. We must pray only for the justice of God. When we do so with unwavering perseverance, God will secure our rights and bring forth His justice.

Justice, in the mind of God, is not only about righting certain wrongs. The prime example of this is the death of our Lord Himself. Clearly, Jesus was purely innocent and yet He suffered greatly. For that reason, would we conclude that the suffering and death of the Son of God was an injustice? Not really. The reason for this is that justice can be achieved best by mercy. Because Jesus embraced the injustice of His suffering and death and turned it into a free embrace out of love, this "injustice" became a sacrifice of love by which an abundance of mercy was bestowed. Jesus had every right to call down fire from Heaven and to destroy those who sinned against Him. But He had a far better plan. Instead, by choosing to accept the injustice of the Cross, and by freely embracing it with His own will, the injustice was transformed and a far greater good came forth.

In our own lives, whenever we are wronged by another, we are often tempted to anger and to desire revenge in the name of justice. We want them to pay for what they did. If you ever feel that way, know that the greatest form of justice is mercy. Know that your free embrace of injustice brings forth the transforming power of God in a way that punishment or retribution could never accomplish. This is the form of justice we must pray for night and day. We must beg God for the ability to accept all sufferings with love, to offer those sufferings as a sacrifice, and to allow them to be transformed into mercy. If this is our persistent prayer, we can be certain that our prayer will be answered. Source of content: mycatholic.life

God Always Hears You

Jesus told a story about a woman who needed help from a judge. The judge was not kind or fair, but the woman kept asking him again and again to help her. She never gave up! Finally, the judge said yes and helped her because she was so strong and kept asking.

Jesus told this story to teach us about praying. He wants us to keep praying to God and never give up—just like the woman. But God is not like the unfair judge. God is good and loves us very much! If even a mean judge listened, imagine how much more God listens to us!

When we pray, we should not just ask for things we want. We should ask for what is right and good. God knows what is best for us, and He always hears our prayers.

Sometimes life feels unfair, like when Jesus was hurt even though He did nothing wrong. But Jesus didn't get angry. He showed love and mercy instead. His love turned something sad into something beautiful.

When someone is unkind to us, we might want to be mean back. But Jesus teaches us to forgive and show love instead. That's the best kind of justice—God's justice. So let's pray every day to have hearts full of love, mercy, and trust in God.



All Souls Mass of Remembrance Sunday, November 2nd at 5:30pm in the Church






New Group starting -Recovering from Divorce for Catholics

St. Teresa of Jesus, **Virgin and Doctor**

St. Teresa of Jesus (of Avila) (1515-1582) is one of the most down to earth spiritual writers that the Church has ever known. She was described as "intelligent, hardheaded, charming, and deeply spiritual." She was wise, yet practical; intelligent, yet much in tune with her lived experience, and an energetic reformer of her Carmelite Order.

Church Historian Leonard Foley (v.2, pp114-115) in his Saint of the Day, said that the "mark she left on the Church and the world was threefold: she was a woman: she was a contemplative: she was an active reformer.

Born at Avila on March 28, 1515, Teresa was later educated by the Augustinian nuns. However, she had to leave that convent because of ill health. Recovering a few years later, she entered the Carmelite Convent at Avila, but left two years later again because of illness, and returned in 1540.

As a woman, Teresa stood on her own two feet, even in the man's world of her time. She entered the Carmelites despite the strong opposition of her father. Teresa lived in an age of exploration as well as political, social, and religious upheaval. It was the sixteenth century, an age of turmoil and reform. Her life spanned the Protestant Reformation and the Council of Trent - from which came the Latin (Tridentine) Mass used by the Church for four hundred years until the Second Vatican Council ended in 1965.

Teresa was a woman for God, a person of prayer, discipline, and compassion. Her heart belonged to God, and her ongoing conversion was an arduous, lifelong struggle, involving much suffering.

Teresa knew well the continued presence and value of suffering (physical illness, opposition to reform in her Carmelite Order, difficulties concentrating in prayer). but she accepted all of it with surrender and even some desire: "Lord, either to suffer for you, or to die."

In 1562, she founded her first convent of reformed Carmelites, nuns who wished a more cloistered and contemplative life, rather than the more relaxed observance of monasticism common in her time. She went on to found sixteen more Carmelite convents, as she travelled through Spain. At the time, she founded her second convent, she met a young Carmelite monk, St. John of the Cross, and with him founded her first monastery for men. Her years of reform and renewal were turbulent years of struggle, but Teresa was equal to the task.




