### REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

"Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

Matthew 24:42–44

If you knew that life was going to come to an end tomorrow, would that affect how you chose to live today?

Entering this season of Advent we are once again given the opportunity by the Church to pray and prepare ourselves for the coming of Jesus - not solely his incarnation as an infant, but particularly his second coming. Amidst the swing of the summer months, I often hear people grumbling that they are looking forward to the next year with hopes that it will somehow be different, better than what they have experienced to that point. I often wonder why we think we must reach some point in the future to find joy now - that the only thing between us and happiness is time.

The new calendar year is a moment of transition that many set as the moment they will begin to make new changes to their life, seeking new ways to find the happiness that has eluded them to that point. These changes are often good but frequently are externally focused - I want to eat better, to lose these pounds, to call people more, or to save more money. These things are good, but I think speak to what Jesus says in today's gospel: "As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day that Noah entered the ark."

As we begin our new liturgical year, Jesus invites us to consider the ways in which he is calling us to deeper preparation for the final judgment. Those things from the time of Noah were not bad things, but their focus was on the things of this world and not the things of God. Maybe in this period of Advent, Jesus is asking you to offer him more of your time each day to grow in trust of him. It could be a new opportunity to appreciate and thank God for all the gifts that he has given you, to thank him for the family, friends, coworkers that he has given you. Maybe growth and preparation during this Advent is making the time to go to confession and allow Jesus to touch your heart and give you his mercy.

If tomorrow were to be your last day of life, would you be prepared to meet Jesus face to face?

May God bless you through this Advent season!

## Stay Awake!

Jesus asks us to "stay awake," which means to pay attention to Him with our hearts. During Advent, we get ready for Christmas. We remember baby Jesus waiting to be born, safe with Mary, and we get excited to celebrate His birthday.

Jesus wants us to notice Him each day. Even though He was born a long time ago, He still comes to us now. He comes to us in quiet ways—in our prayers, in our hearts, and in the love we show to others.

When we "stay awake," we remember that Jesus is with us. We try to listen to Him and to love Him. Advent is a special time to ask ourselves, How am I loving Jesus today?

Jesus tells us to be ready for Him anytime. He will come again one day, but He also comes to us right now. Sometimes He speaks to us in little whispers in our hearts. When we are quiet and peaceful, we can hear Him better.

Advent helps us open our hearts to Jesus, so His love can grow in us more and more.





# St. Columban, Abbot - November 23



The greatest Irish missionary to continental Europe, St. Columban, became a monk as a young man on the advice of a holy woman who lived as a hermit. He understood her advice as a call to renounce the world and to seek God in monastic solitude. It was only when he was 45 years old that he left the monastery with the blessings of his abbot and went to Gaul with twelve companions to reinvigorate religion which had suffered from the destructive invasions of the Barbarians. They preached with some success, known for their charity and devotion and for their rigorous discipline.

The monasteries Columban founded became centers of religion and learning, the most famous of which is that at Bobbio in northern Italy. It was there that he died in the year 615. Columban recommended to his monks contemplation and the study of the Scriptures as the means of knowing and fulfilling the will of God. That study was to be undertaken devoutly and calmly.

The preservation of European civilization and culture must be credited to these missionary monks and their successors. Their austerity and discipline served them well in the task of carrying the message of the Gospel to a continent ravaged by Barbarians. They built the foundation for the marvelous culture of the High Middle Ages and Renaissance. Western civilization and the Church owe much to their zeal, their prayers and their example.
